Here is your old gad-about friend, Jessie Adamson, writing a few lines from the Ozarks.

From Fort Smith, Arkansas, I came through the Boston Range of the Ozarks. To be sure, we westerners know that the Ozarks are not even a third cousin to the mountains of New Mexico, Colorado and Wyoming. But just the same, folks, "Thars beauty in them thar hills " There is breathtaking, marvelous beauty.

On leaving Fort Smith we are at once enthralled by the swiftly unfolding panorama of autumn colors. The hills, valleys, and along the streams are thickly wooded with trees of several varieties, elm white oak, post oak, cottonwood, willow and blackjack, with a scattering of cedar and pine. All these combine into beautiful autumn colors. The somber brown of the blackjacks makes the background for the ever changing scene of 'golden leaves and red' of the rust and dark green. These lovely colors in ever changing patterns create a feast for the eyes never to be forgotten.

In this region are many beautiful homes, and one of the best loved aspects to me were the tall chimneys of wood burning fireplaces. On this particular frosty morning the sight of smoke curling out from these chimneys brought a sensation of warmth and cheer to the heart of a traveler from West Texas where the trend of progress has eliminated long ago the com fort and romance of wood burning fireplaces.

We had a rest stop at Fayetteville. It is a lovely town. But I'm afraid I'll remember it as a place where the coffee shop in the bus station was closed on Sunday morning. It was nine o'clock and I had not been to breakfast. So you know me, I was hungry and tired from traveling, and as we left that lovely town in the Ozarks I was rather peeved that the cafe people failed to realize that folks away from home get hungry on Sunday, the same as any other day




