Scattered Shots

Thanks to Mrs. Doyle Messer for furnishing the information requested last week on Babbs Switch, Okla. Mrs. Messer states that this is the same as the Babbs located south of Hobart, and that the school now on the same site is called Babbs Memorial School. She adds that soon after this fire the Oklahoma legislature passed a law requiring school doors to open outward, to prevent another similar tragedy.

Changing the subject, do you ever think about how much our English language has borrowed from others? The Southwest especially shows the Spanish influence, naturally. The Spanish word vaca, or cow, led to the word vaquero, or cowman, which was adopted as it stood in the Southwest, and changed to buckaroo in other parts of the country. When American cowboys adopted the methods of the Mexican vaquero, they naturally took up many of the terms, such as corral, reata, rancho, which we changed to ranch and numerous others. We converted juzgado to hoosegow, and calabozo to calaboose, but the words are still Spanish in origin. Miners too used many Spanish terms, such as bonanza, which means fair weather or a rich mine, and borrasca, which has the opposite meaning. Chile con carne is a popular dish throughout the Southwest, but it is a mistake to call for a bowl of chile, which is actually only calling for the red pepper.

The Mexicans have reciprocated by borrowing a good many of our English words. If you know Spanish pronunciation you will have no difficulty in deciding what sport they are indulging in when they use terms like ampayer, jom, liga, ompleit, jonron, beisbol, and the like. It should be mentioned that liga is an actual Spanish word, but it was not used in the sense of a baseball league until the Mexicans took up American

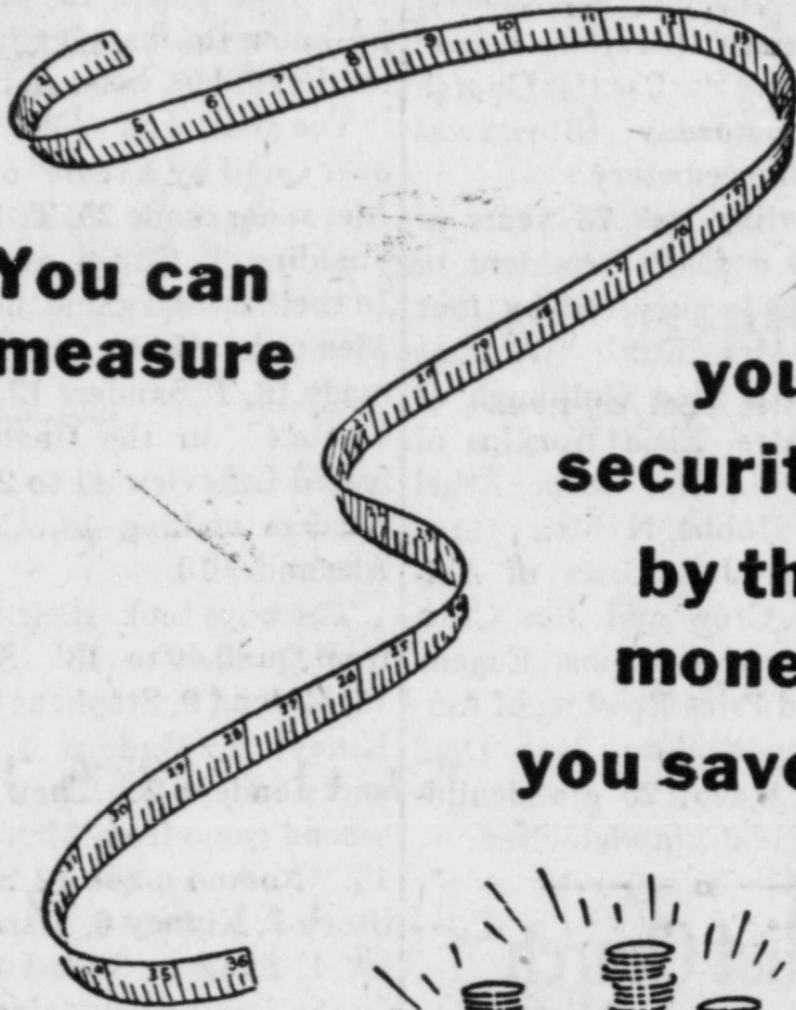

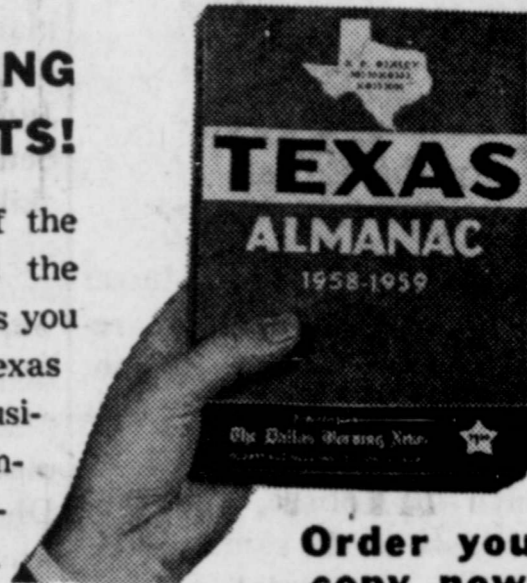

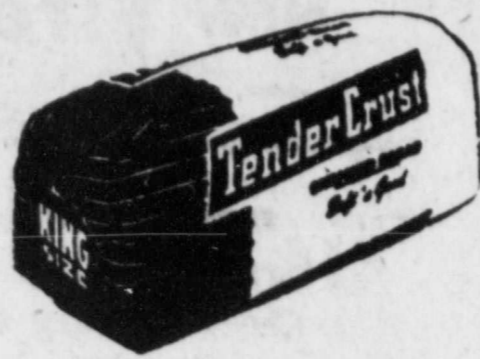
