## To Build Memorial Hospital at Groom

Plans have been made and work is under way in soliciting funds to build a Memorial Hospital in Groom. The proposed structure is for 16 beds and to be so arranged to care for 10 additional patients in case of an emergency. The building and equipment will be completely modern and the building fireproof.

It will be a non-profit organization, operated by a local Board of Directors and can be used by any doctor who is qualified and has a license to practice in the State of Texas.

The building and equipment will cost approximately \$200,000.00. Half of this amount will be supplied through funds made available under the Hill-Burton law passed by Congress to assist in the construction of hospitals operated on a non-profit basis. This will leave \$100,000.00 to be raised by individual donations from all of the communities served by the hospital.

The Groom Osteopathic Hospital has served a large area for the past twelve years but the demands for more beds and more facilities makes the need of a larger and more modern hospital necessary. The City of Groom has agreed to assume the responsibility as the sponsoring organization and the drive for funds is under the direction of a committee from Groom composed of Mayor James C. Ledwig; C. L. Culver, banker; L. M. Britten, farmer; and Dr. John L. Witt.



## An Enjoyable Visit to New Mexico

Mr. and Mrs. J. P. Gilbreth just returned from Espanola, N. Mex., after spending a week with their son Richard and family. Mrs. Gilbreth's comment follows:

We certainly had a grand time seeing so many sights in the mountains. We went up about 15 miles in the mountains east of Espanola to Santa Cruz on a fishing trip. to the Hidden Lake. It was a treacherous road. I figured we were about the only ones crazy enough to go, but when we got in sight of the lake, looking down four or five hundred feet, there were about 250 cars already parked and people fishing on the first day of the fishing season, some in motor boats. Two rivers empty into the lake.

The next day a business man in town called and asked Rich and Preston to go with him fishing, so they went back and had good luck caught 22 rainbow and speckled trout. Pres caught 3 on 2 hooks in the boat. Better ask him how he did it.

We also visited the oldest settlement in the U. S. on the Rio Grande (1598) near San Juan Indian pueblo. We visited the church where Rich and Betty go, the Evangelical United Brethren, which was very pretty, done with natural stone.
