Greenbelt Dam News To Be On TV

Delegations from the seven cities comprising the Greenbelt Municipal and Industrial Water Authority will leave for Austin Monday morning. The hearing on the permit to build the dam will be before the State Water Board at 2 p. m. Monday. At least two car loads from Hedley are expected to attend.

The Authority also made an appointment to meet with Joe Clarke Attorney for the Texas Board of Water Development, at 10 a. m. the same day.

There was a meeting at Childress last week of the Directors of the Authority. The purpose of the meeting was to iron out the final steps before the hearing. Mayor Carl Reid, City Secretary M. O. Weatherly and C. L. Johnson local director and Secretary Treasurer of the Authority attended. No serious objections to the permit are expected but all seven cities of the authority want to be well represented.

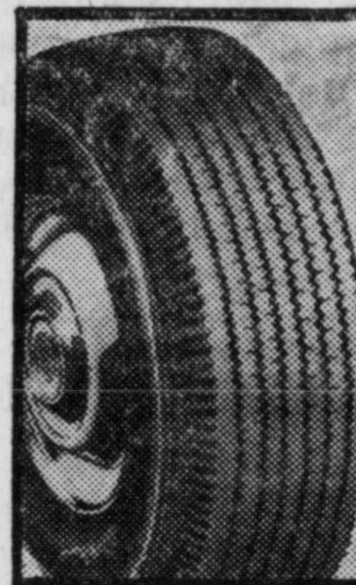

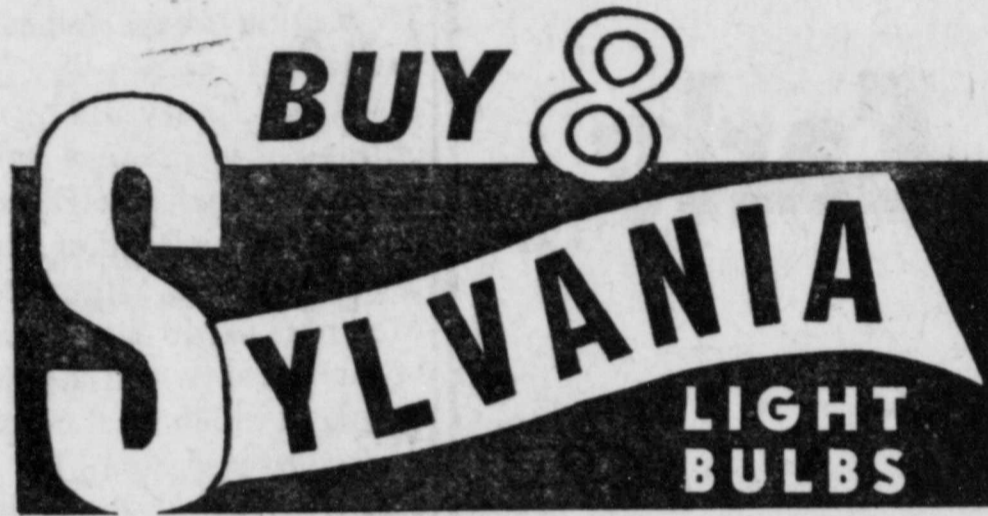
