## ASC News

Chairman Cooke of the Donley County A S C Committee reminded farmers who have signed a 1959 contract in the conservation reserve of the Soil Bank that those contracts took effect April 15 in most cases.

Where a conservation practice started on the designated land before April 15, Mr Cooke said, the contract took effect when the conservation use began. After a contract goes into effect, the farmer is obligated not to use the Soil Bank tract for grazing livestock and not to harvest a crop from the land.

The County Committee again urges all farmers who will not plant their cotton allotment, or any part of it, to release the allotment acreage in order that they can reapportion it to other cotton growers in the county. Please keep in mind that the final date for releasing cotton allotment acreage is April 17.

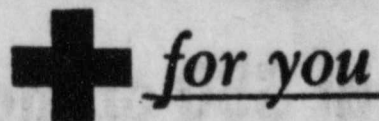

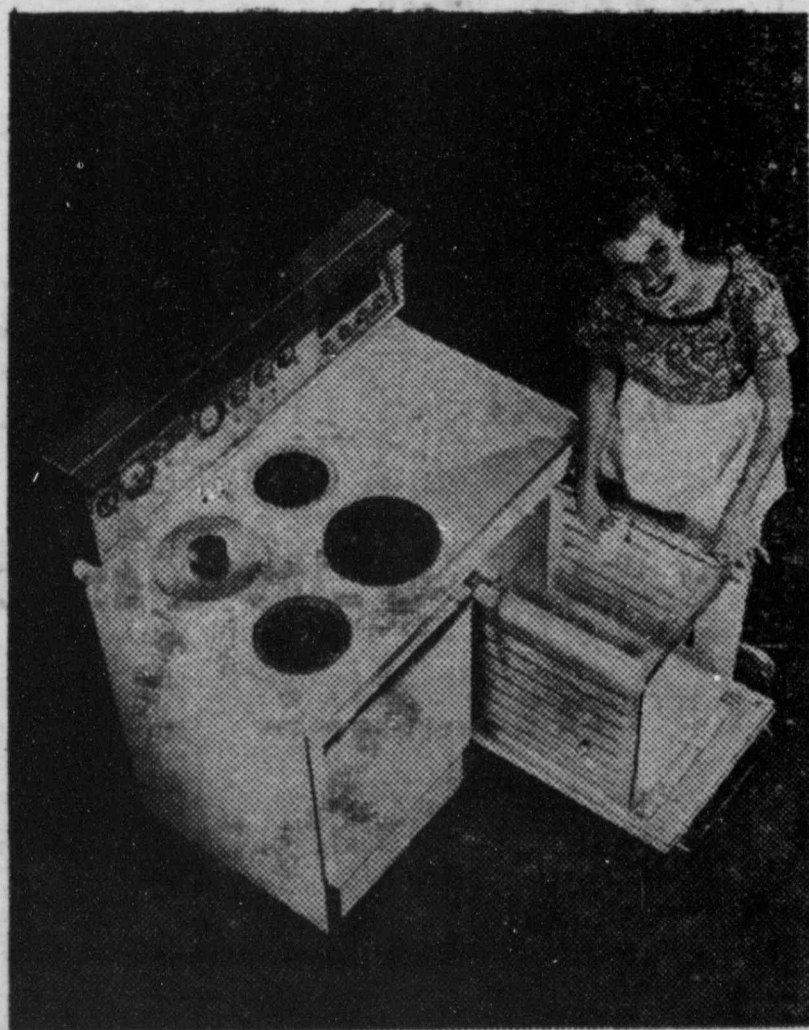

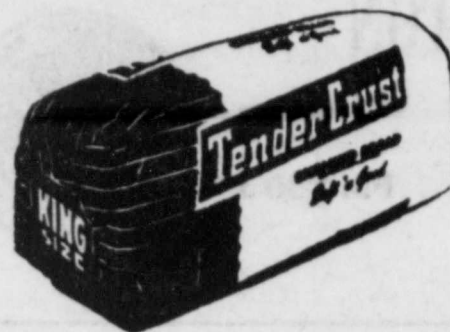
