## Greenbelt Dam News J. B. Masterson

The topographical maps of the Salt Fork of Red River and the area drained by the river were received by the Greenbelt Water Authority Monday, June 22nd. The maps had been expected by the Authority some time back and progress on the dam was halted until they were received. No fur ther delay is expected and progress can be resumed at a normal rate issue. now.

The Authority's engineers, Freese and Nichols of Ft. Worth, now have a copy of the map and are getting their data. Within a short time they will have the in formation to allow the Authority to let the contract for the coring of the river bed at the present location of the dam site

However this delay will probably not amount to anything in the long run as no election was anticipated until September, when most of the voters will be back from vacations. Daily sampling of the water at the dam site will continue to September 1st.



#### By the Editor

Somehow this column has been left out most of the time in recent weeks, going on the theory that local news is of more interest than personal comments. However 1 have learned that this column has at least one reader, so this column is for his benefit, and the rest of you don't have to read it if you don't want to.

One anniversary that passed by without comment last month was that of the bat le of Milway which took place 17 years ago, in June of 1942 This battle was one of the most important ever fought by this nation's armed forces, and was actually the turning point of the Pacific war, a fact which was not real zed by our own commanders for some time.

Six Japanese aircraft carriers were invo'ved in the attack on Pearl Ha bor which led to this country's declaration of war At the time of the Midway battle two of these were undergoing repairs, but four of the carriers which had attacked Pearl Harbor were present. They were the Kaga, Akagi, Hiryu and Soryu A number of American torpedo bombers were ficed when they failed to the Jap carriers but a followries of attacks by American bombers succeeded in sinking ur of the Jap carriers. In the e of the war Japan managed place the carriers, but never ame the shortage of trained nnel which resulted from sinkings, which is why Mid has been called the turning of the war. is was so disastrous a defeat pan that the Japanese people ot learn the truth until 1951, al years after the close of the and they only learned then ise two former Japanese offivrote a book describing the n. Perhaps this defeat was ed only by that of the battle yte Gulf, which took place n 1944, and which was the st naval battle ever fought in orld. 




