Festival To Be Listed In The Texas Almanac

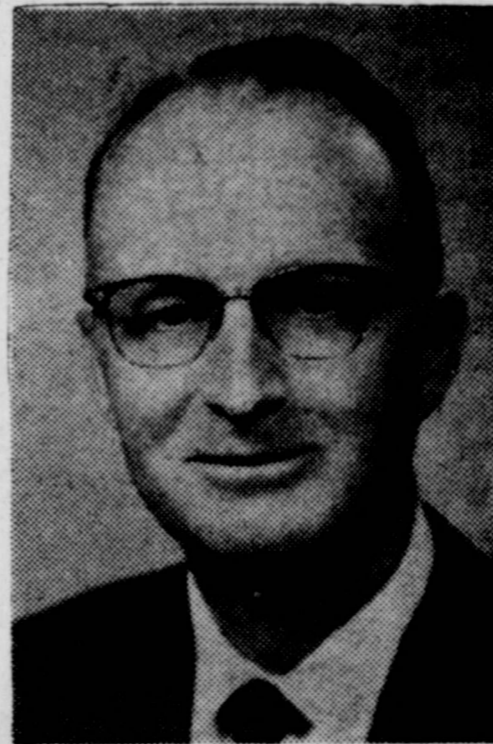

District Governor To Crown Queen



This year's Cotton Festival Queen will be crowned by Lions District Governor Don Zimmerman of Hereford. Gov. Zimmerman's district includes 59 clubs in the Texas Panhandle, running west from Childress and North from Springlake. We are fortunate that he could take time out from his travels to be with us.

Zimmerman, a Lion since 1946, is in the hardware business at Hereford. He graduated from Pampa high school in 1929, and took a Bachelor of Arts Degree from the University of Oklahoma in 1933. He was retired from the Army Reserve Corps in 1956 with the rank of Lt. Colonel.

In addition to holding all offices in the Hereford Lions Club, he has served the district as Zone Chairman, and as Deputy District Governor. In 1958 he was awarded the coveted plaque as "Hereford's Man of the Year."

Zimmerman is also scheduled to speak to the Festival on Saturday afternoon. He is considered an interesting public speaker who, "always has an important message," for his listeners.

He married Ernestine Tripp of Norman, Oklahoma in 1933 and they have three sons, all Eagle Scouts, and all in college at this time.

Mr. and Mrs. Zimmerman plan to be in Hedley before the parade and remain until after the coronation.
