In the sixty-six books of the Bible there is a lot of information given on the subject of prayer. 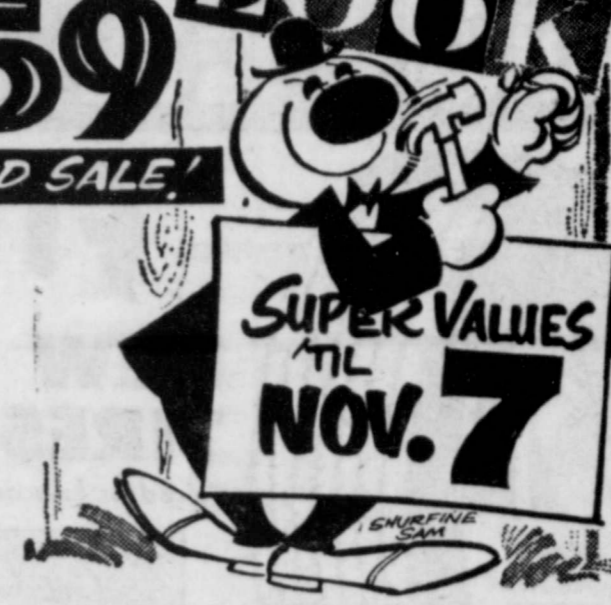
