Chili Supper to Aid Crippled Children

Members of Lions Clubs throughout Texas this month are pausing to pay recognition to their camp for crippled children which has given 4,284 handicapped youngsters a new dimension of freedom since it was opened in 1953.

The camp, located at Kerrville in the Hill Country of Central Texas, is free to any crippled, blind, deaf or mute child between the ages of 7 and 16. The 16 permanent buildings dotting the 504 hillside acres represent an investment of more than \$600,000.

At the camp, these youngsters who have been denied a normal childhood through no fault of their own learn to shed their shyness imposed by their handicaps. By mutual association with other handicapped children and by skillful and gentle counseling, these youngsters have found the freedom to grow, mentally and spiritually, into useful citizens of tomorrow.

Hedley Lions Club's tribute to the camp for this year is in the form of a fund raising project. The club invites everyone to come out to their chili supper on Thursday night, Nov. 19. You can eat all the chili you want, then visit or play games. The serving will start early so that those who wish to attend the church services in progress will have plenty of time to do so.

All proceeds from this supper will go to the camp. Let's all come out, have a good time together, and help a worthy cause. We know a man never stands so straight as when he stoops to help a crippled child.

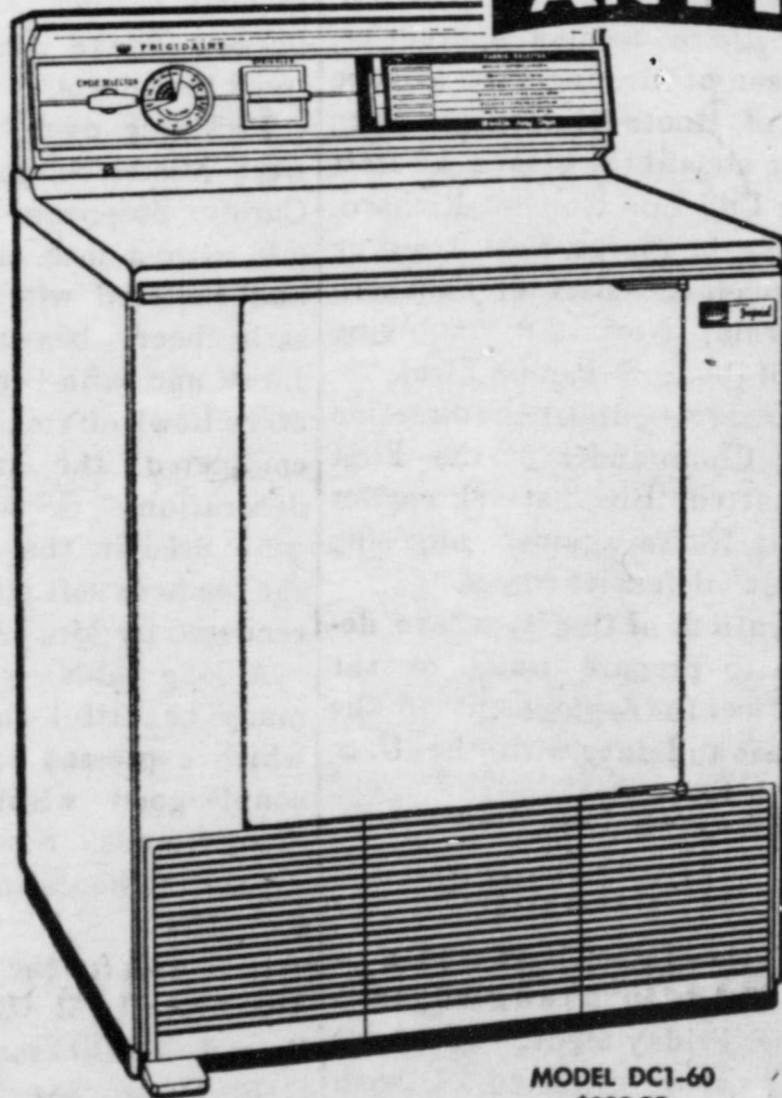

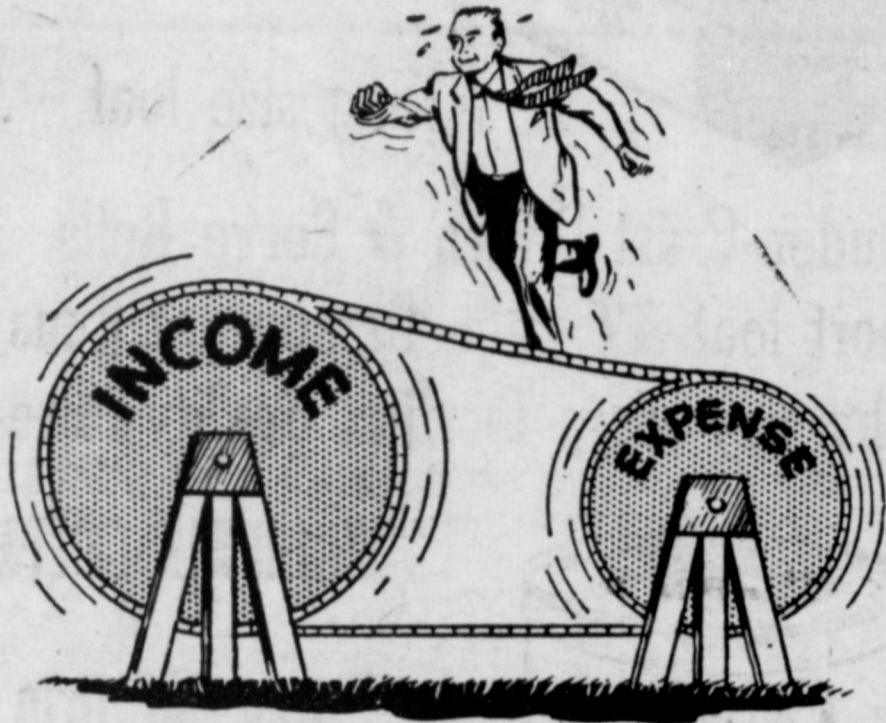
