Bank Deposits Pass Million Mark

The Security State Bank reached a million in deposits Monday for the first time since the bank was organized in 1913. They reached a million in total resources last year and kept pretty well over the million mark all the year but this is the first time they have reached the million in deposits only, which were \$1,026,540.40.

With cotton still coming in and several hundred bales of cotton still ungraded the bank feels they will have an exceptionally good year and deposits should remain over the million mark until well over the first of the year.

The Sin of Achan

After the victory at Jericho, Joshua was confident that Ai, a small town up the hills a short distance from Jericho, would be easy to conquer, so he sent only a small part of his army to fight there. However the Israelites were defeated, some of the men killed and the rest driven back. Joshua and all of Israel were very disturbed at this setback for they realized that God had withdrawn his help from them. Joshua prayed to God, as we often do in time of trouble, but God said there was sin in the camp of Israel and it must be straightened up. All of the people were called to come before Joshua and the leaders of the tribes, and Achan, a man of the tribe of Judah admitted to have stolen a robe and a wedge of gold and some silver from the plunder of Jericho, hiding it in his tent. His punishment was immediate and harsh, for he and his family were taken to a valley and stoned to death, their bodies and possessions burned and rocks piled on them in order that anyone passing there might remember Achan's sin. Achan thought because he had hidden the things he took, no one would know it, forgetting that God sees everything that happens and even knows every thought that passes through our minds whether we express them or not. Realizing that God is omnipresent should help us to try more carefully to do only the thing that is right before Him.

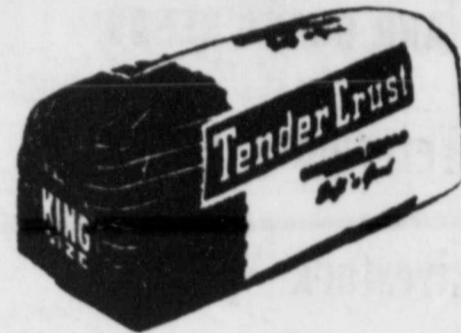
