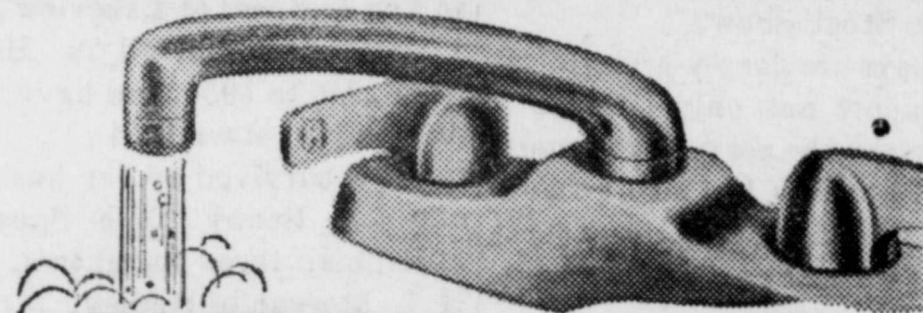

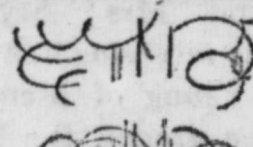

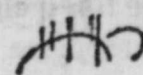

The Heart of Man

The physical heart of man is a muscular pump by which the blood is driven through all parts of the body. It is a tireless member, working day and night from before birth until the end of life, resting only between beats. The heart of a baby beats 120 times a minute, in a child of seven ninety times, and in the average adult 72 times. About five ounces of blood are moved each beat, a total of 21 pounds a minute, 15 tons a day, and 5,475 tons a year. All this and much more done by a flattened pear shaped pouch about the size of a closed fist, averaging five inches from base to apex, 3½ inches across and 2½ inches thick. Its approximate weight in men is 11 oz., in women 9 oz. There are many references in the Bible to the heart of man, used in the sense of denoting the seat of life or strength, meaning mind, soul, spirit, and the entire understanding of man. We are told to believe with the heart, obey from the heart, purpose in the heart, concerning giving. In these references Bible writers are stressing the thought that God demands the best that man can offer, that he will not accept half service or half obedience, that the mind of man must be in subjection to the will of God to be pleasing unto Him.
