### Greenbelt Dam News School Opening

Last week the City Council of Childress voted unanimously not to call a \$648,000 00 water improvement bond election for that city. They agreed to wait until they received a copy of the Green. belt Water Authority report from Freese, Nichols, and Engress, engineers for that authority.

The coring of the river at the Greenbelt dam site was completed and the data turned over to the engineers some six weeks ago-They are preparing a report on the cost of the proposed dam, amount of land the lake will cover, the ap proximate cost of that land, the cost of a filter plant, cost of pipe lines, and the cost of right-of-way for the pipe lines. They will also compute the amount of water each city in the authority has been us ing in the past, the probable amount of water that would be sold to these towns, and the cost of filtered water to each town, per 1000 gallons.

After the report is received, there will be two more elections necessary. One will be necessary to contract to purchase water from the Greenbelt Water Authority, and another to vote the bonds Both elections could be held at the same time.

Herbert C. Petry Jr, Chairman of the Texas Highway Commission stated in a recent letter, that the proposed Hedley McLean highway which would cross the river just below the dam site, will have full consideration of the Highway Commission.

Seniors are reminded that they must have 17 credits for graduation. These credits must include 4 of English, 3 of math, 3 of History, 2 of Science, 2 of P. E., and 2 Vocational.

### Insurance Credits

Hedley will receive a 3% insurance credit on the town's Key Rate, which will amount to 2¢ per hundred on all insurance in the next few days. This credit was granted after the fire chief attended, and passed an advanced fire fighting course at College Station recently. This reduction will be noticed as your insurance policies become due, and are renewed.

Coupled with the 10¢ credit the State Insurance Department has already given our Fire Department for its efforts, this will reduce the Key Rate from 80¢ to 68¢. A credit will also be due soon for cleaning, greasing, and painting the fire plugs, and a 2¢ credit for having 65% noncombustible roofs in the residential area. This could be reduced another 2¢ if we had only 10% less wooden roof buildings. Outbuildings count as well as dwellings. You could help the rate by tearing down any useless wooden roofed outbuildings.

The town only needs two more blocks of paving to have its commercial district covered, which would give another 2¢ credit. It is hoped that these two blocks can be paved soon. Hedley's Key Rate can't be cut 39¢ at a time or even 10¢ at a time. It must be done penny by penny, with everyone cooperating to help decrease the fire risk in our community. Every cent taken off the Key Rate today will save you money for years to come.
