Soil Bank Programs

When a producer is notified by this office that noxious weeds are found growing in his C R field, he must dispose of those weeds in a reasonable length of time. When livestock or livestock tracks are found in a C R field, the producer must prove to the county committee that grazing was not intentional. One may do this by writing a letter of explanation to the county committee or by meeting with them in a regular committee meeting. If the committee does not accept the explanation as accidental, the producer is in violation of his contract and subject to penalties.

## Boys Ranch Rodeo

**Micah**

Micah, one of the Old Testament writers, a man inspired of God, apparently did his work somewhere between 722 B. C. and 690 B. C. In rich eloquence he describes the fall of Jerusalem and Samaria, the capitals and strongholds of God's people, saying 'Zion shall be plowed as a field and Jerusalem will be in heaps.'

He attributes this forthcoming downfall to the forsaking of the teaching of God. This had brought about a corruptness of the government which abused the rights of the people openly, but hypocritically claimed to 'lean on Jehovah.' Micah wrote in this prophecy of a vision he had of the far distant future in which he saw the coming of the kingdom of God, saying 'the mountain of Jehovah's house shall be established—and all the people shall flow into it,' and that from Bethlehem should come forth one who would rule God's people

Like Micah of old, all through the ages, men of God have spent their lives teaching God's word and warning of the fate that awaits people who refuse to obey it. Even in "these last days" there are those who refuse the truth and deny that there can be a place of eternal punishment, but an honest study of the Bible, the only authentic information that we have from God, leaves no doubt as to the realness of burning destruction for those who fail to obey the commands of God.

**Proposed CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT  
NUMBER TWO ON THE BALLOT**

PROPOSED CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT TO BE VOTED ON AT AN ELECTION TO BE HELD ON NOVEMBER 8, 1960.

SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 4 proposing an Amendment to Section 49-b, Article III of the Constitution of Texas, increasing to three and one-half percent (3-1/2%) the maximum permissible interest rate on bonds hereafter issued by the Veterans' Land Board; providing for an election and the issuance of a proclamation therefor.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

Section 1. That Section 49-b, Article III of the Constitution of Texas, be amended by adding thereto the following:

"The foregoing notwithstanding, bonds hereafter issued by the Veterans' Land Board pursuant to the authority of this Section 49-b of the Constitution may bear a rate or rates of interest not to exceed three and one-half percent (3-1/2%) per annum.

"This Amendment shall become effective upon its adoption."

Sec. 2. The foregoing Constitutional Amendment shall be submitted to a vote of the qualified electors of this state at an election to be held throughout the State of Texas on the first

Tuesday after the first Monday in November, 1960, at which election all ballots shall have printed thereon the following:

"FOR the Amendment to Section 49-b of Article III of the Constitution of Texas by adding thereto a provision authorizing the Veterans' Land Board to issue the bonds authorized under such Section to bear interest at a rate or rates not to exceed three and one-half percent (3-1/2%) per annum."

"AGAINST the Amendment to Section 49-b of Article III of the Constitution of Texas by adding thereto a provision authorizing the Veterans' Land Board to issue the bonds authorized under such Section to bear interest at a rate or rates not to exceed three and one-half percent (3-1/2%) per annum."

If it appears from the returns of said election that a majority of the votes cast were in favor of said Amendment, the same shall become a part of the State Constitution and be effective from the date set forth in said Amendment, and the Governor shall issue a proclamation in keeping therewith.

Sec. 3. The Governor of the State of Texas shall issue the necessary proclamation for said election, and shall have the same published as required by the Constitution and laws of the state.
