TAKE NOTICE that on the 12th day of September, 1960, the Commissioners' Court of Donley County, Texas, will pass an order authorizing the incurrence of claims and accounts against the Road and Bridge Fund of the County for the purpose of acquiring and purchasing lands necessary for the rights of way in respect of U.S Highways and Texas State Highways in said County, and to defray all expenses incidental thereto, and which said proposed indebtedness will not exceed the principal sum of Sixty Thousand and no-100 Dollars (\$60,000.00).






