


Farm Facts

Farmers have gambled with weather since Cain planted the first seed. In some years Nature is kind. At other times it looks like the cards are stacked against the farmer. He has to play his hand against drouths, rains, heat, cold, hail, winds, killing frosts or unseasonable freezes.

For almost a decade, back in the 1930's, hot, dry winds seared the Great Plains of the United States, creating the Dust Bowl, impoverishing thousands of farmers and forcing them from the land.

Hoping to market their products for premium prices, vegetable growers may gamble and plant a little earlier. Unseasonable weather often exacts a disastrous toll in which the grower not only loses his labor and seed but his fertilizer as well. Such weather, too, has meant disaster for many a citrus grower, killing trees that have taken several years to reach the bearing stage.

Prolonged wet weather encourages plant diseases and impairs the quality of fiber

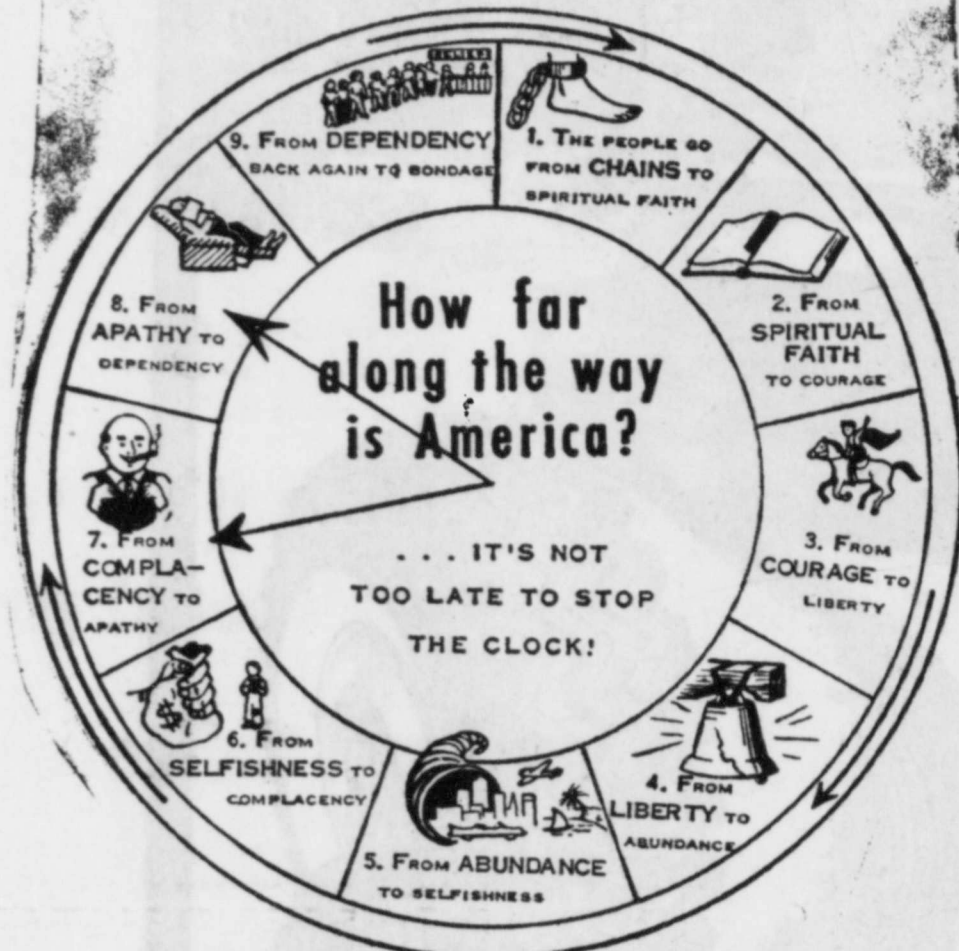

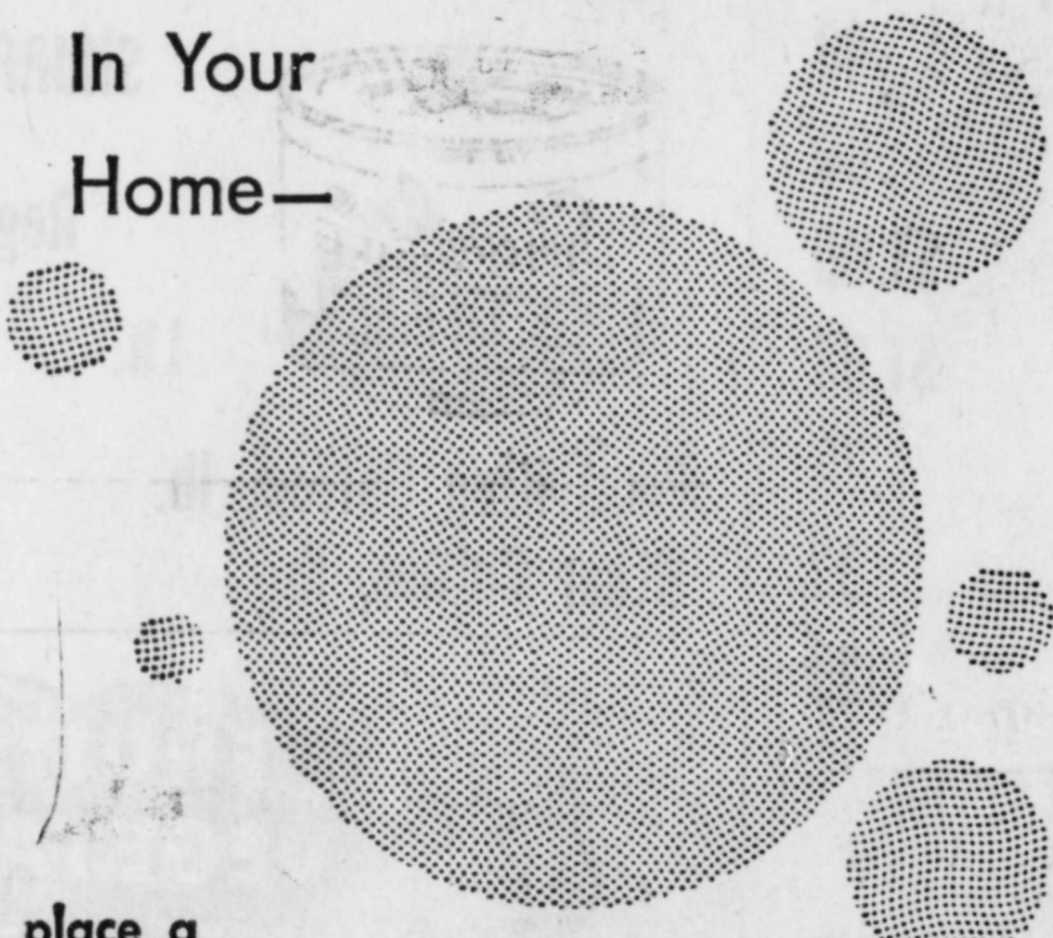
