The 1959 Census of Agriculture, conducted in Donley County last fall, counted 450 farms, according to a preliminary report just issued by the Bureau of the Census, U.S. Department of Commerce. Total land in farms was 467,039 acres. The average size of farm was 1,037.9 acres. The average value of farms (land and buildings) in the county was \$41,190

Of the county's farm operators 194 owned their farms, 145 owned part of the land and rented additional acreage, and 107 were tenant farmers.

The average age of farm operators in the county was 53 4 years. There were 90 farm operators 65 or more years of age.

Of the 450 farms in the county, 368 were commercial farms.

Detailed statistics on crops, livestock, equipment, etc , are presented in the preliminary report, with comparable statistics for 1954. Copies of the county re. port may be obtained for 10 cents each from the Bureau of the Census, Washington 25, D. C.




