Jan. 31 Deadline For Getting Most Grain Loans

Farmers have until Jan. 31, 1961, to cover their grains and a number of other 1960 crops under the price support program. For wheat, compliance with the individual farm allotment is required in order to be eligible for price support on the crop.

The 1960 crops for which Jan. 31 is the deadline for obtaining loans or purchase agreements include wheat, barley, oats, grain sorghums, rye, flaxseed and soybeans.

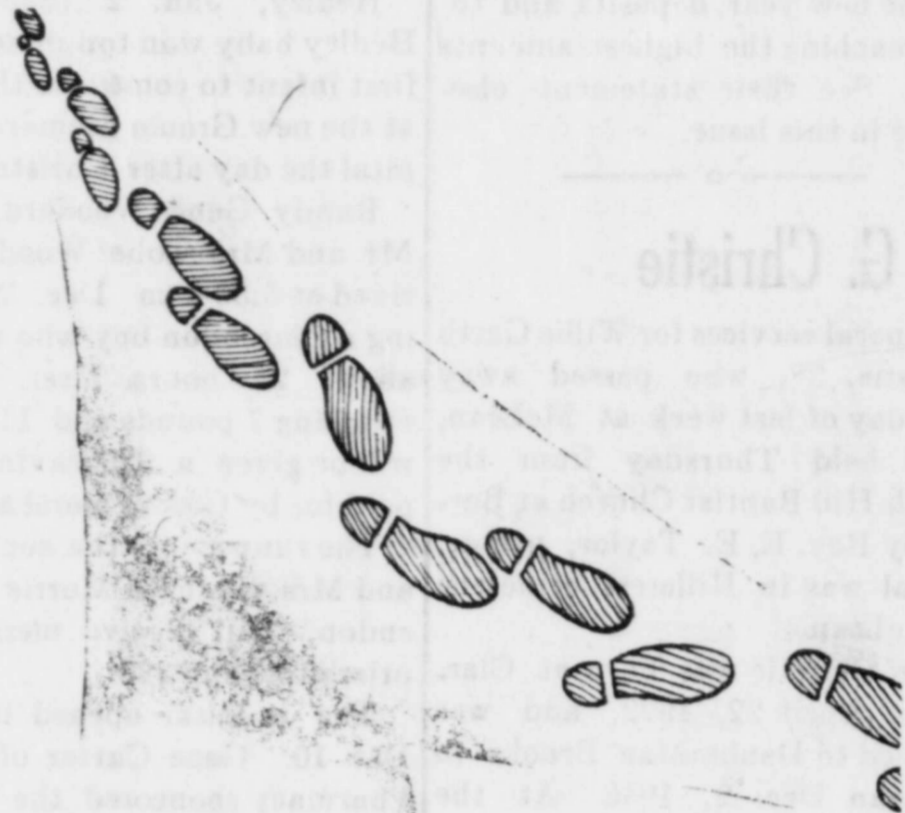

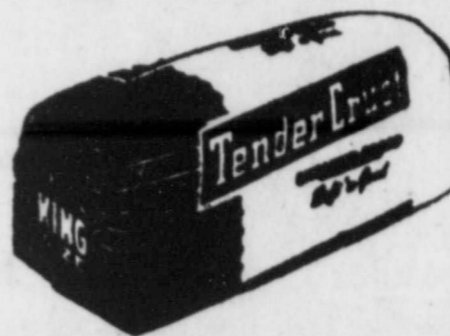
