William Ivan Jones

William Ivan Jones passed away Tuesday, May 16, at St. Joseph's hospital in Houston after suffering a stroke the previous Thursday.

Funeral services were held Friday in the First Methodist Church in Hedley by Rev. S. A. Wolfe, pastor, assisted by Rev. J. S. Tipton, pastor of the First Baptist Church. Music was by the church choir and a special song, "An Evening Prayer," was rendered by H. E. Austin, a nephew of Mrs. Jones. Burial was in the Clarendon cemetery under direction of Spicer Funeral Home.

Pallbearers were Walter C. Johnson, Ross Springer, Roy McKee, Ansil Adamson, C. R. Hunsucker, and Bill Scales

Ivan was born Oct. 26, 1917 at Hedley. He was converted and joined the Methodist Church at the age of seventeen. He graduated from Hedley High School in 1936, leaving an outstanding record as a track man. His records in the regional meet at Canyon in the 100 yard and 220 yard dashes stood for a number of years. He left his home town to attend Rice Institute at Houston on a track scholarship and was a member of the 440 relay team at Rice which held a world record for a short time. He returned to Hedley and then moved to Amarillo.

An abiding interest in meeting people led Ivan to his career, interviewer with the Texas Employment Commission. He joined the Commission in Amarillo and was transferred to the Houston office in 1955. He had been with them about twelve years.

He is survived by his widow, Mrs. Hazel Irene Jones; three daughters, Mrs. Beverly Christian, Miss Edith Varue Jones and little Terri Kay Jones; and one granddaughter, Lisa Rhea Christian, all of Houston; and his parents, Mr. and Mrs. W. H. Jones of Hedley.

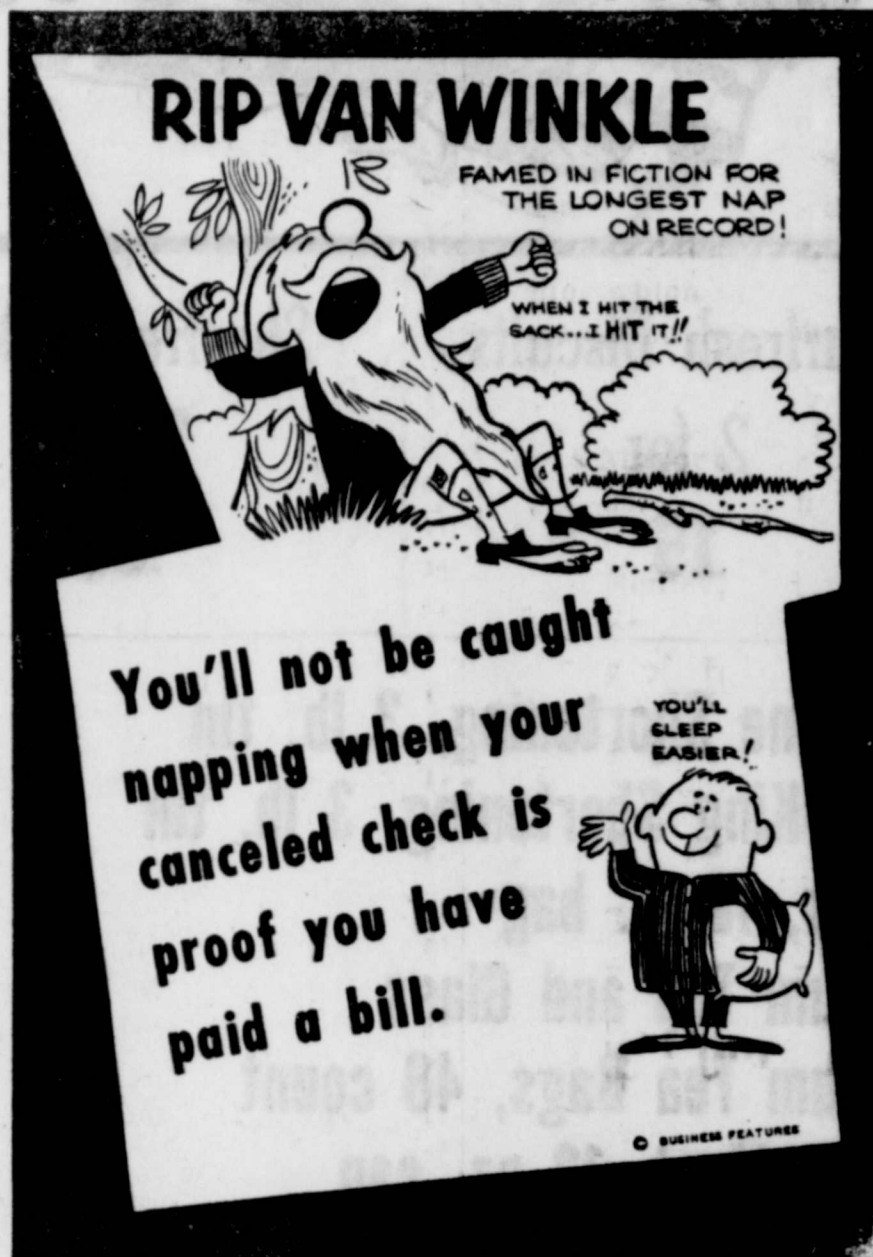

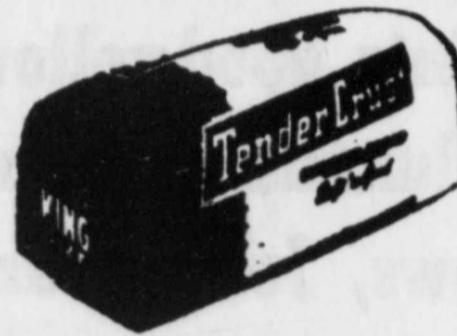
