Tenth Cotton Festival Is Notable Success; Sara Spalding Is 1961 Queen With Leveta Helms and Sammie Sanders As Princesses

The Tenth Annual Hedley Cotton Festival, held here last Friday and Saturday, was perhaps the most successful of the entire ten. The weather cooperated beautifully, and many observers believed that the largest crowd yet viewed the parade and other events on Saturday.

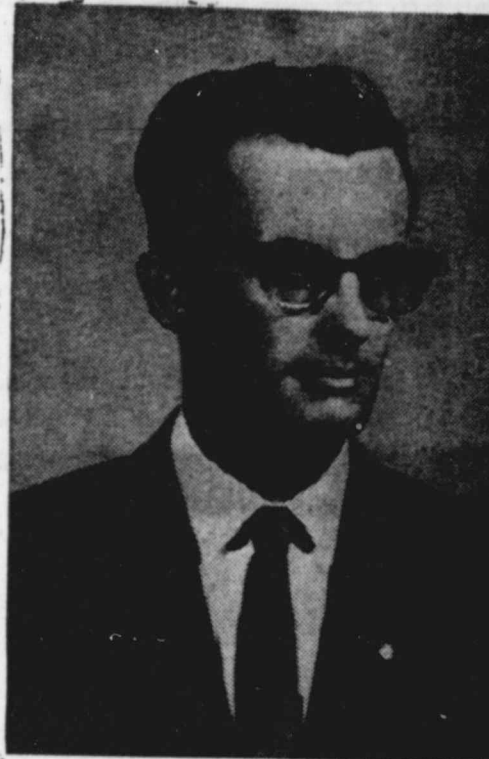

REFRIGERATOR ROLLS

Crumble cake of yeast over 1/4 cup sugar. Set aside. Melt 1/2 lb margarine or butter. Add 1 cup of milk to melted margarine or butter to make lukewarm mixture. Stir sugar and yeast together to make a liquid and add to milk and margarine or butter. Add 2 eggs, beaten. Add 4 cups flour and 1 tsp salt. Chill 4 hours. Shape into rolls and let rise at room temperature till doubled. Bake 15 minutes at 400°.

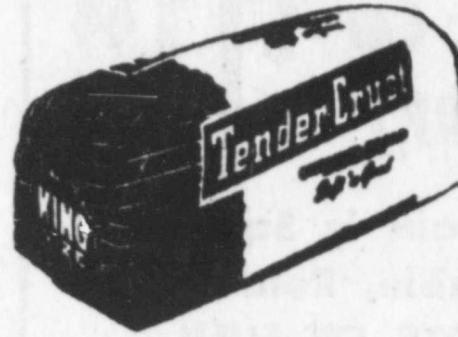
