There were two new members voted into the club. They are Mrs. Roy Hunter and Mrs. Bill Mathews.

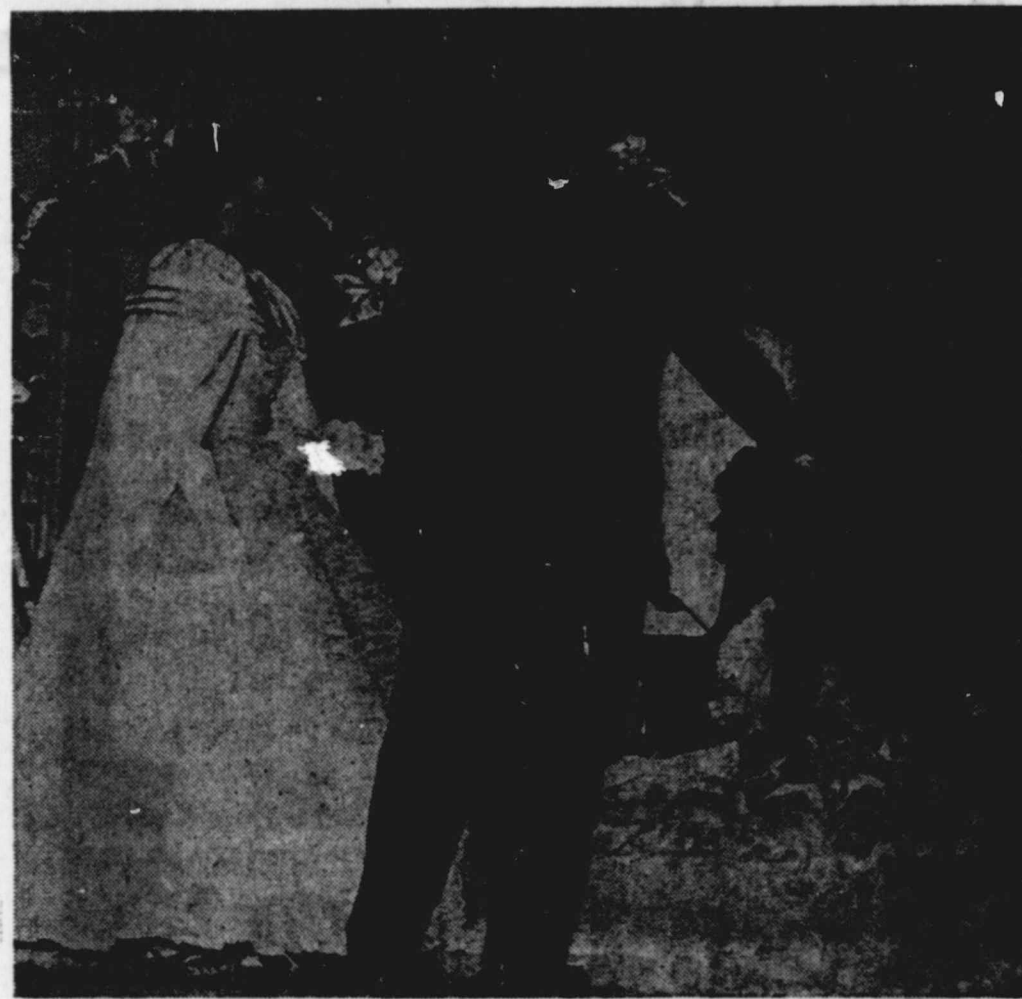

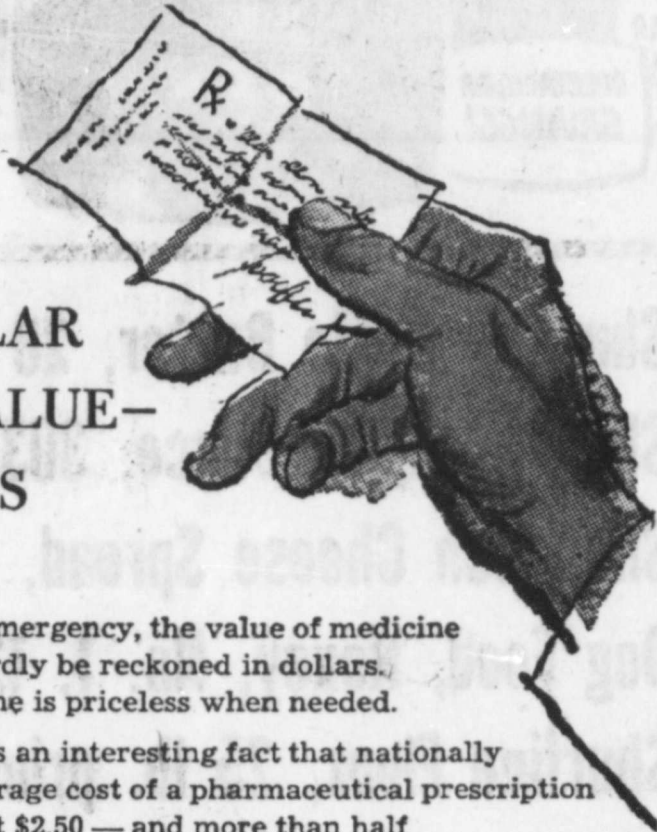
