## Road Approved

Last week County Judge R. E. Drennan of Clarendon and Boyd Meador of McLean received letters from State Highway Engineer D. C. Greer, stating that the proposed road from Hedley to McLean would follow the route requested by the delegation from Hedley and McLean which went to Austin recently. The letter follows:

'The Highway Commission has given most careful consideration to the presentation of your delegation on Oct. 26, with reference to the location of RM 2695 south of McLean in Donley County.

It was the decision of the Highway Commission that this section of RM 2695 would be constructed along the 'Creek Route' rather than along the 'Ridge Route' as proposed by the engineering staff. This decision was based upon the statements made by you and your group relative to the additional local service that would be rendered as well as the savings that would be enjoyed by the county in the contribution of the right-of-way.

The Highway Commission sincerely appreciated your comments regarding this mutual problem."

Naturally this is fine news for residents of both Hedley and McLean, and we are looking forward to the beginning of construction on the new road.

### A. S. C. News

Dec. 12 is the date set for the referendum on marketing quotas for the 1962 cotton crop, the Donley ASCS Committee reminds cotton growers. At least two thirds of the upland cotton farmers voting must approve the quotas if they are to be effective.

If marketing quotas are approved in the referendum, price support will be available to growers who comply with their 1962 upland cotton farm allotments at a level within the range provided by law—between 65 and 90 per cent of parity. If quotas are not approved for the 1962 upland cotton crop, the allotment program will remain in effect, and price support will be available to cooperators at 50 per cent of parity, as provided by law.

Under a quota program, growers who exceed their 1962 farm acreage allotments would be subject to penalties of 50 per cent of the cotton parity price as of June 15, 1962 on the farm's excess production of the crop. In addition, one of the upland cotton produced on the farm would be eligible for price support.

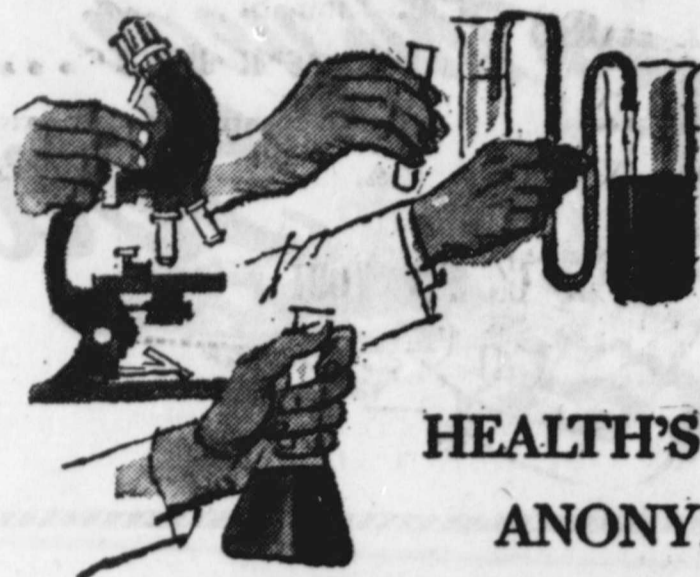

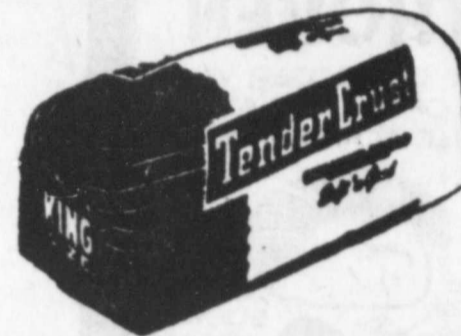
