## Greenbelt Dam

A third dam site which will cut the cost of the proposed Greenbelt Municipal and Industrial Water Authority about 20 per cent and improve the water has been selected, according to information released in a letter by Dr. S. H. Townsend, Authority president, to directors of the Authority. The letter follows:

"Several days ago I was in the office of Freese, Nichols and Eadress, and I found that the engineer's report would be forthcoming within a few weeks. I expect it at any time.

'After studying the water analysis reports for over five years, they found that some years the water carried more sulphate than other years. They sent engineers to study the water shed to find the reason. They tested water from wells in both the Salt Fork and the White Fish Creek water sheds. They have found that the water from White Fish Creek carries three or four times the amount of sulphate as the water from Salt Fork. So with the above information, they have selected a dam site above the mouth of White Fish Creek.

'They will have a complete report including the cost, on the two sites and it will be up to the people to decide which they want. By going above White Fish Creek, we will cut out roughly 20 per cent of the water shed, but the hardness of the water will be about one half.

'We will not make any decisions until all the facts are before us and as stated above, I expect them at any time now."

**A. S. C. News**

Any land designated as conservation reserve and subsequently used for non-agricultural enterprises (including commercial hunting) shall constitute a violation of the contract.

Hunting on C R land shall be considered commercialized when a C R producer signs an agreement which transfers to someone other than the owner or operator the control of trespass on the land under contract.

All C R producers are cautioned to avoid any agreement with hunters which would constitute a violation and result in the forfeiture or repayment of the annual C R payment.

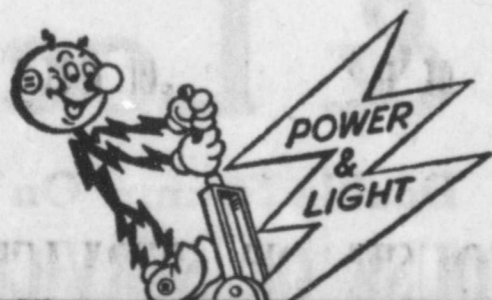

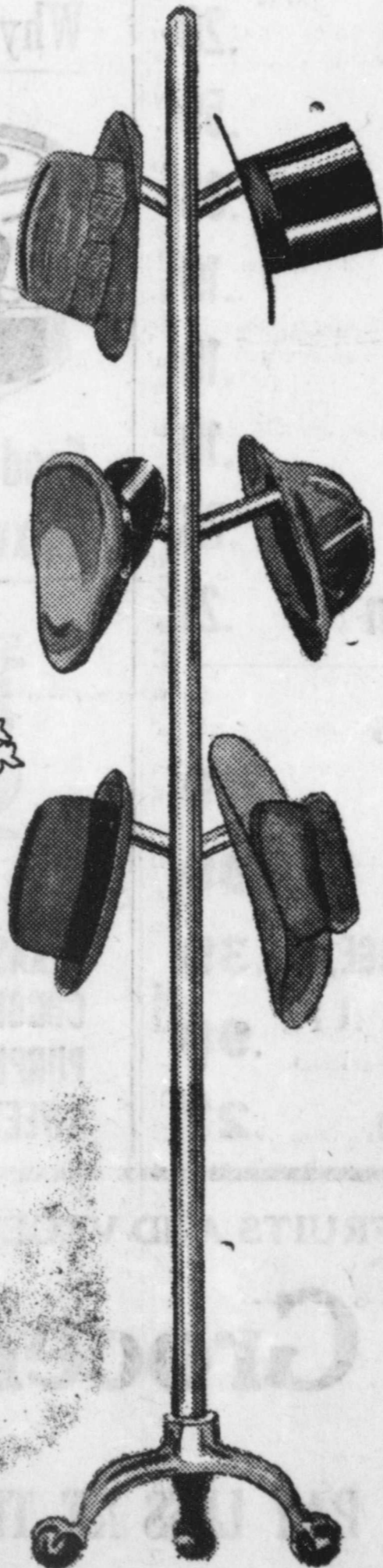

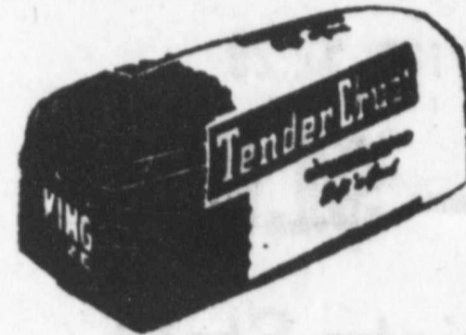
