The referendum on the 1962 crop of cotton will be held December 12, 1961, to determine whether marketing quotas will be in effect on such crop. If more than two-thirds of the farmers voting over the nation approve marketing quotas, penalties will apply on farms having excess cotton acreage in 1962 and price support will be available to cooperators within the range of 65 to 95 per cent of parity, the exact level to be announced later. Cotton producers should keep the date in mind and not only make it a point to vote in the referendum but also to encourage other eligible voters to vote on this important matter.

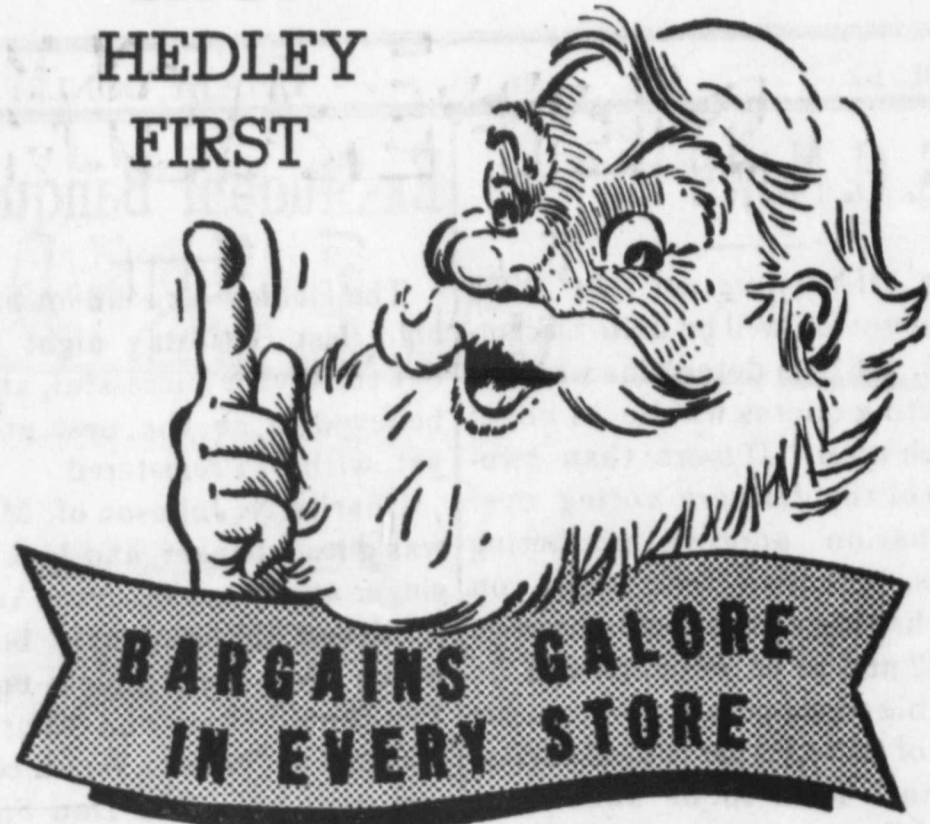

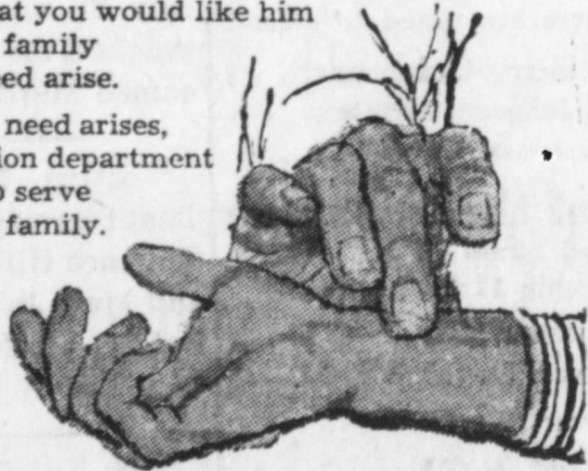

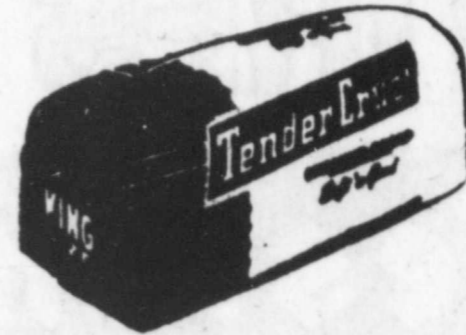
