The honoree received a large number of lovely gifts. A number of out of town guests called during the affair

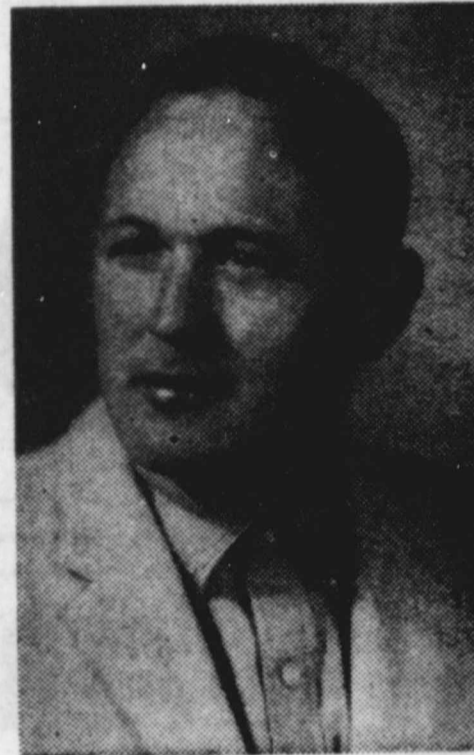
## Hedley P.-T. A.

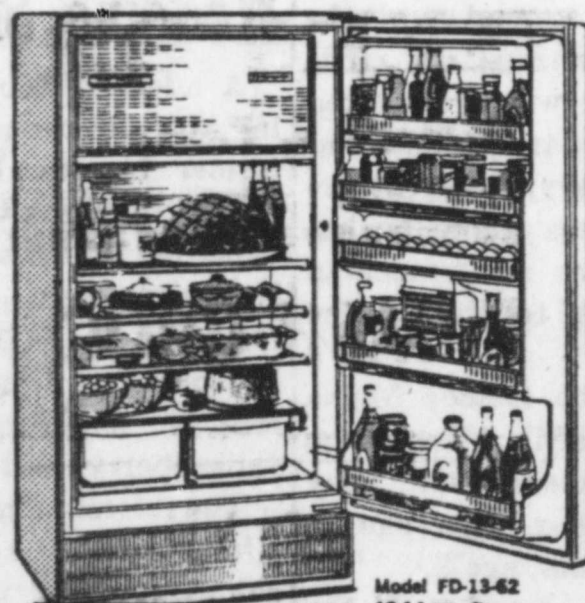
