The organization of a new oper ating district of the West Texae Utilities Company has been annonnced by Cal Young WTU president.
The new operating district will be know as the Panhandle District It was formed by conbining the Quanah and Childress Districts J. C. Randel, manager of the Quanah District and acting manager of the Childress District, has been named manager of the new distriet.
Randel, who has been manager of the Quanah District since 1956, assumed supervision of both disoricts in December of last year following the death of Allan Shaban, manager of the Childress District.
The new district will be the Company's third largest, comparable in size to the Abilene and San Angelo Districts
The district office, which will be located in Cbildress, will be almost in the exact center of the Panhandle District The district will extend approximately 60 miles in each direction; from Vernon on the east to Quitaque on the west, from Sbamrock on the north to Paducah and Matador on the south.
