School Election

Please take note that there will be a school trustee election in Hedley on April 7, 1962. There will be two trustees to elect.

Deadline for filing for this office will be March 8. Requests must be in writing and filed with the County Judge.

City Election

Please take notice that a City Election will be held at the City Hall in Hedley on the first Tuesday in April, 1962, the same being the 3rd day of April, for the purpose of electing a Mayor and three aldermen. The two candidates for aldermen receiving the first and second highest number of votes will be elected for two years, while the candidate receiving the third highest number of votes will be elected for one year.

Any citizen who is a qualified voter of the City of Hedley who wishes to enter his candidacy for either of these offices must file his application with the City Secretary on or before the 3rd day of March.

New WTU District

The organization of a new operating district of the West Texas Utilities Company has been announced by Cal Young WTU president.

The new operating district will be known as the Panhandle District. It was formed by combining the Quanah and Childress Districts. J. C. Randel, manager of the Quanah District and acting manager of the Childress District, has been named manager of the new district.

Randel, who has been manager of the Quanah District since 1956, assumed supervision of both districts in December of last year following the death of Allan Shahan, manager of the Childress District.

The new district will be the Company's third largest, comparable in size to the Abilene and San Angelo Districts.

The district office, which will be located in Childress, will be almost in the exact center of the Panhandle District. The district will extend approximately 60 miles in each direction; from Vernon on the east to Quitaque on the west, from Shamrock on the north to Paducah and Matador on the south.

Young emphasized that only the two district offices were involved. He pointed out that in no event would personnel in the district offices concerned lose seniority or be released.

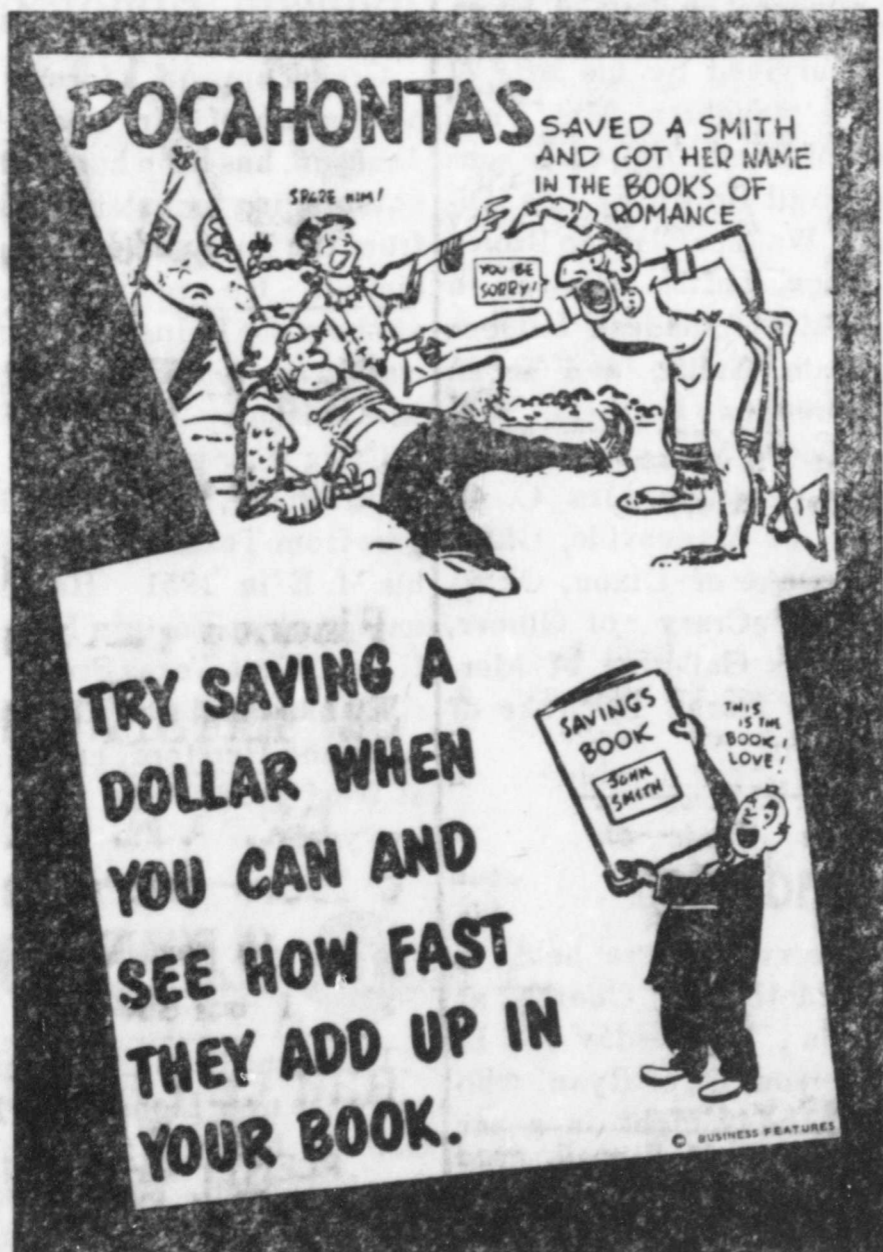
