

- 1. Grass seeding; this can also be carried out on Soil Bank Land.
- 2. Deep Plowing, sandy land
- 3. Terraces; standard and diversion terraces.
 - 4. Deferred grazing
 - 5. Wells, stockwater.
- 6. Dams; stockwater and erosion control dams.
- 7 Sod Waterways.
- 8. Cotton Burs.

Release And Reapportioned Cotton Acreage

April 13th is the closing date for releasing cotton acreage and requesting additional acreage. If you do not intend to plant your cotton allotment or any part of it. please release it to the county committee. Releasing the allotment helps you to preserve your history and also helps the county to preserve the cotton history.

Maturity Date Of 1961 Grain Loans

All 1961 Wheat and Grain loans will mature on March 31, 1962. Any farmer who wishes to redeem his grain from the CCC loan must do so by the above date. CCC will assume title to all wheat and grain sorghum under 1961 loan that has not been redeemed by the farmer by the maturity date.


