The road has been designated as Ranch Road 2695.

Most teachers of the Hedley school system have been hired for another year, according to announcement last week by Supt. Mack A. Bush. They include Mrs. Joyce Boliver, Miss Hazel Coursey, Mrs. Ida Lou Dickson, Mrs. Geneva Thomas, Connie DeBord, Doyle Messer, Mrs. Sue Shields and J. M. Baker. At an earlier school board meeting Supt. Bush was given a two year contract, and Billy White was given a two year contract as principal and coach.

The board has not yet decided how many teachers to hire from the local maintenance fund, and the other teachers will be considered at a later meeting. The school is presently paying 1 1/2 teachers from focal funds.

In other action the school board passed a retirement policy to become effective with the 1963-64 school year, that all persons becoming 65 years of age will be retired. However, upon a special vote of the board the age may be extended. The school will also require a health certificate of all teachers and school employees.

The school is now in the process of selecting new textbooks for next year.

1. Grass seeding; this can also be carried out on Soil Bank Land.
2. Deep Plowing, sandy land only.
3. Terraces; standard and diversion terraces.
4. Deferred grazing
5. Wells, stockwater.
6. Dams; stockwater and erosion control dams.
7. Sod Waterways.
8. Cotton Burs.

Please check with us and with your help this can be the best year in the history of this county with regards to Conservation.

Release And Reapportioned Cotton Acreage

April 13th is the closing date for releasing cotton acreage and requesting additional acreage. If you do not intend to plant your cotton allotment or any part of it, please release it to the county committee. Releasing the allotment helps you to preserve your history and also helps the county to preserve the cotton history.

Maturity Date Of 1961 Grain Loans

All 1961 Wheat and Grain loans will mature on March 31, 1962. Any farmer who wishes to redeem his grain from the CCC loan must do so by the above date. CCC will assume title to all wheat and grain sorghum under 1961 loan that has not been redeemed by the farmer by the maturity date.

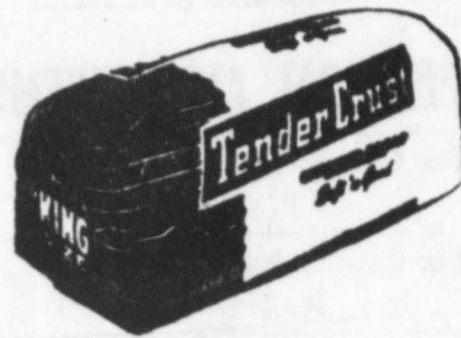
