**1962 Feed Grain Program**

Producers who intend to participate in the 1962 Feed Grain Program should keep the following points in mind:

1. Must not be grazed after May 1, 1962.

2. No crop may be harvested from diverted acreage in 1962.

3. Diverted acreage must be protected from wind and water erosion by an adequate cover, or by summer fallowing if approved by the County Committee. Acceptable cover crops include perennial or annual grasses, perennial or annual legumes. (Remember, Guar is now a "Substitute Crop" and if planted on diverted acreage even as a cover crop such acreage becomes ineligible for payment.)

4. If you wish to be approved to use summer fallowing as a conserving use of diverted acreage it will be necessary for you to make a written request to the County Committee.

5. All acreage designated as diverted acreage which is later reclaimed must be devoted to a conserving use and otherwise treated as diverted acreage until such time as it is officially reclaimed.

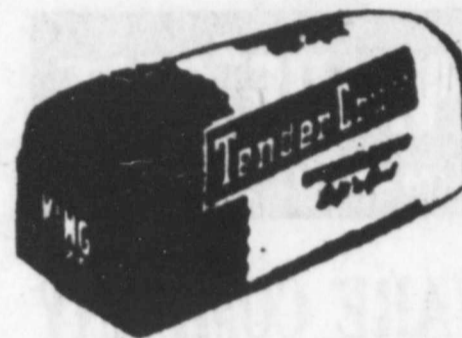
