that in view of the fact the hund booster windshield wiper, Deing season is fast approaching, he froster fan and rain cap wanted to advise hunters of the new law that he caused to be enacted and passed during the last session of the Legislature.

It has to do with people who are unable to walk great distances and permits them to hunt from motor driven vehicles, so long as it is not from a public road. The law states as follows:

H B No 733

"Article 901. Any person so incapacitated as to render self lo comotion in pursuit of game hazardous to his health may, with a written authentication by a licensed physician of such an incapacity, hunt from an automobile provided no attempt will be made by one so incapacitated to hunt upon any part of the road system of this State."


