

Farm Facts

more money than ever before. In the face of the trend toward larger farms, credit helps provide the things they need to produce more effi-

The farmer's use of credit will continue to mount, notes W. D. Curtis, economist with the Louisiana State Agricultural Service. This will be due to: (1) greater investment per farm; (2) an increase in the use of power, fertilizer, chemicals, better seed, and other production necessities; (3) failure of savings to keep pace with mounting capital needs; and (4) a more businesslike approach to eredit - if convinced it will pay them to borrow, they borrow.

From 1953 to 1960, the dollar volume of farm credit system loans increased 120%, while the number of farms decreased 30%. Long-term mortgage loans by federal land banks increased 18%, ate-term loans by production farms.


