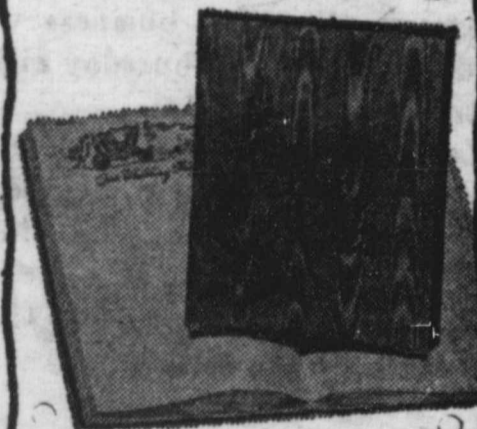

#### Gas Tax Refund

Annual claims for refund of federal excise tax paid on gasoline, used on a farm or ranch for farming or ranching purposes must be filed with the Internal Revenue Service director by October 1.

According to IRS Dallas District Director Ellis Campbell, Jr., refund claims should be made on Form 2240 for gasoline used between July 1, 1961, and June 30, 1962.

Forms and a helpful booklet, "Farmer's Gas Tax Refunds," are available at IRS, or County Agricultural Agent offices.

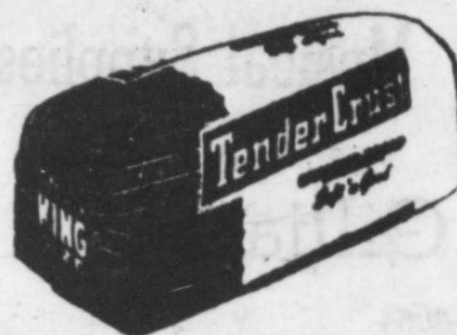
