Adult Classes at Clarendon Jr. College

Monday night Jan. 28, 7:00 p m has been set for the enrollment of students from the Clarendon Junior College area in the second semester of the adult education on night school program. This announcement was made by Oliver J. Abel, Dean of the College and Director of the night school. The following courses will be offered during the spring semester of the night school program when a sufficient number of students have been enrolled to justify the class in most cases this number will be set at a minimum of 10 students. With the exception of classes in Bible, Oil Painting, and General Chemistry, the night upon which each of the classes will meet will be determined by the students in each class at the first regular session. Bible 137, (Life and Teach ings of Jesus) and Oil Painting will meet on Monday night General Biology will meet on Tuesday night.

In addition, the following classes will be offered: Beginning Typing, Intermediate Typing, Beginning Shorthand, Intermediate Shorthand, Bookkeeping and Accounting, Arts and Crafts-Creative Hobbies, Government 223 (State) American History 213, General Chemistry, General Physics, Business Math, Business Law, English 113 (Composition and Grammar)

All classes will meet one night weekly. The length of the class session is determined by the semester honr value of the course. For example, three hour courses will meet from 7:00 to 9:40 one night weekly.

The cereal is mentioned in the Bible and mythology and dates back to 3500 B.C. in Mesopatamia, 3000 B.C. in Europe, and 2000 B.C. in China.

Barley has the shortest growing season of any cereal and because of this can be grown in the cool climate of Norway or in hot, dry Morocco.

Although used primarily for livestock feed in the United States, barley is an important item in the human diet in parts of Africa and Asia.


