Amendments

There will be four state constitutional amendments to be voted on Nov. 9

No. 1 is a proposal to abolish the poll tax as a requirement for voting

No. 2 is to increase the amount of funds available for payments to the needy aged, the totally disabled, the blind, and needy children under 16.

No. 3 would authorize Jefferson County to provide retirement, disability and death benefits for all appointive officers and employees within Jefferson County

No. 4 would increase the amount of bonds or obligations that may be issued by the Veterans' Land Board.

Cotton Classing

The first light frost of the season on Friday and Saturday only affected the cotton plant in some counties, but it checked cotton harvesting according to K. E. Voelkel of the Agricultural Marketing Service's Cotton Classing Office in Memphis, Texas

Through Friday, Nov. 1, total samples classed amounted to 27,000. As of the same date last season 30,000 samples had been classed. We classed 10,500 samples during the week with 6 classing tables in operation. On Thursday we initiated the second Fibronaire set up thus permitting us to keep up with the "miking" of each sample from 55 of the 56 gins in this classing territory

Percentage-wise, the grades of cotton decreased from that classed the previous week; however, the predominant grade was Middling Light Spotted, 15-16 inch, which was the same as the week before.

The U. S. Department of Agriculture points out that farming employs 7.4 million workers—more than the steel industry, automobile industry, or transportation and public utilities combined.


Ten million people have jobs storing, transporting, processing, and merchandising agriculture. Six million have jobs providing the supplies farmers use.

- Baking—299,000 employees and a payroll of more than \$1.3 billion.
- Fruits and vegetables—172,400 employees and a payroll of \$591 million.
- Cotton broadwoven fabrics—242,500 employees and a \$722-million payroll.

Investment in agriculture is equal to three-fourths of the value of assets of all corporations or three-fourths of the market value of all corporation stocks on the New York Stock Exchange.

Social Security News Watch Your Vote!

Hal Geldon, district manager of social security in Amarillo, issued a reminder today to all persons who are receiving social security benefits that they must notify the Social Security Administration whenever something happens that might affect the payment of their benefits. Some of the events which must be reported are:

1. Earnings from all types of work if the beneficiary is under age 72 and expects to earn more than \$1200 during the year.
2. Death of a beneficiary
3. Change in marital status—unless the beneficiary is receiving payments as a retired worker.
4. Change of custody of a child or other person for whom you are receiving benefits
5. Change in address

"Social security beneficiaries received a list of these and other events that must be reported with their check earlier this year," Geldon said. "If they do not have this list, they may pick up another at the social security office. In fact anyone who has a question about social security should get in touch with us to get correct information."

The address of the social security office is 1006 Adams Street.

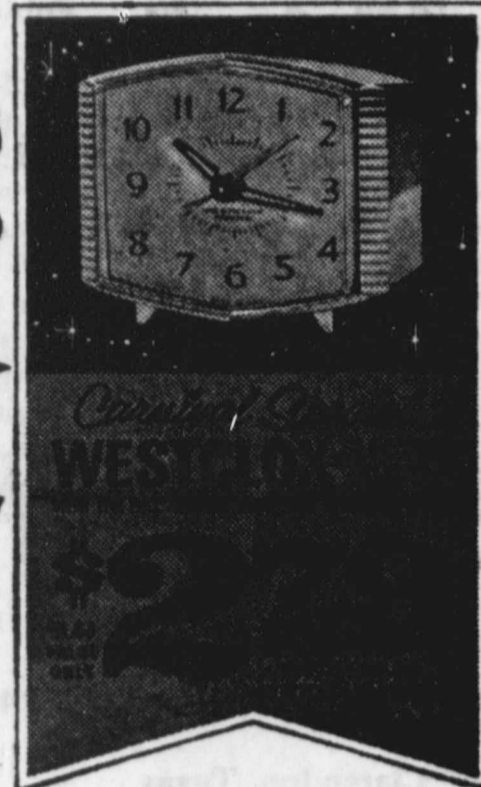
