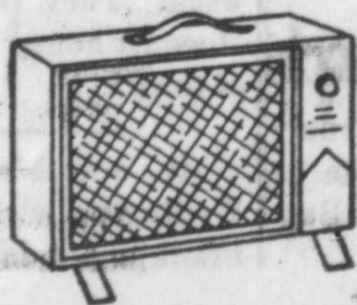

It is difficult to tell what cotton has been sprayed so it is just best not to feed gin trash to livestock. If cotton fields are sprayed for defoliation then do not graze them

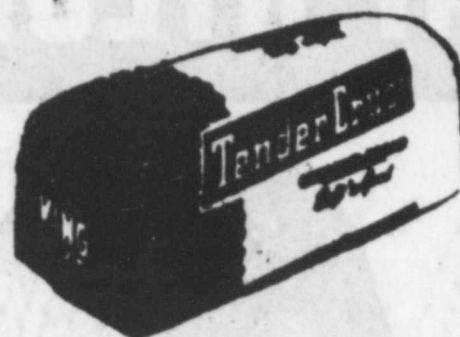
