## John R. Gillham Announces Candidacy For County Attorney

John R. Gillham, long time resident of Donley County has announced his candidacy for the office of County Attorney. Gillham has been a resident of Donley County since 1937 when he moved here from Miami to become Secretary of the Clarendon Chamber of Commerce and to be associated with the local school system. He has been active in church and civic work during his entire stay in Clarendon.

Gillham served as county coordinator of the Donley County G I School from 1947 to 1954, and he taught a G I Class at Hedley for over four years of this period. A large number of the twenty three G I Students he had in class here for four years are still residents of the Hedley Community.

Gillham received his B S Degree from West Texas State University, his M S Degree from Texas A. & M., and his law degree from Baylor University. He opened his law office here and began the practice of law in September.

In announcing his candidacy Gillham stated that he wished to be considered for the office on the basis of his qualifications and his ability, and that he believed that the people of Donley County knew him well enough to know whether or not he would put forth every effort possible to do a good job, should he be elected to the office. He stated that he would make every effort possible to contact each voter in the county before the election and would sincerely appreciate any consideration the voters saw fit to give his candidacy.

At the present time Gillham is Secretary of the Clarendon Lions Club, Director of the Donley County and Hall County National Farm Loan Association, President of the Clarendon Methodist Men's organization, a member of the Donley County Board of Education, and is chairman of the newly selected Donley County Highway Committee.

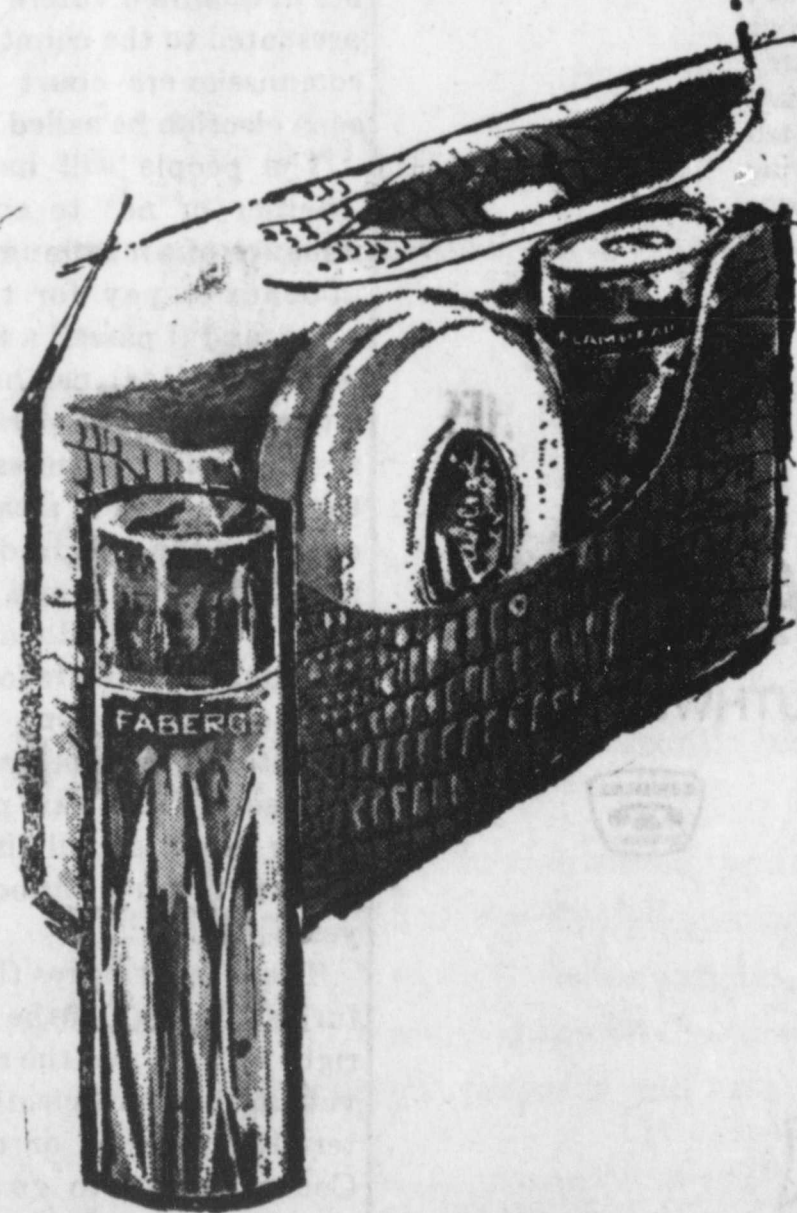

**Bond Election**

A countywide bond election to determine whether or not the people of Donley County desire to authorize their governing body to issue bonds to purchase the county's fifty per cent of the right of way necessary to construct a four lane highway from the Donley County Line near Memphis to Clarendon is scheduled for Dec 21 1963. The election was called recently after the required number of qualified voters signed and presented to the county judge and commissioners court asking that such election be called.

The people will be voting on whether or not to authorize the issuance of a maximum of \$100,000 in bonds to pay for the right of ways, and if passed a tax of fourteen cents (14¢) per hundred dollar valuation for a period of twenty years will be necessary to pay the bonds. This means fourteen cents per one hundred dollar valuation, one dollar and forty cents for one thousand dollar valuation, and fourteen dollars for ten thousand dollar valuation. No raise in valuation will be necessary but the fourteen cents tax per hundred dollar valuation will be necessary and will be for a period of twenty years.

The state requires the county to furnish one half of the cost of the right of way, and the result of the vote in the bond election will determine whether or not Donley County is able to go ahead with the four lane construction through the remainder of the county.

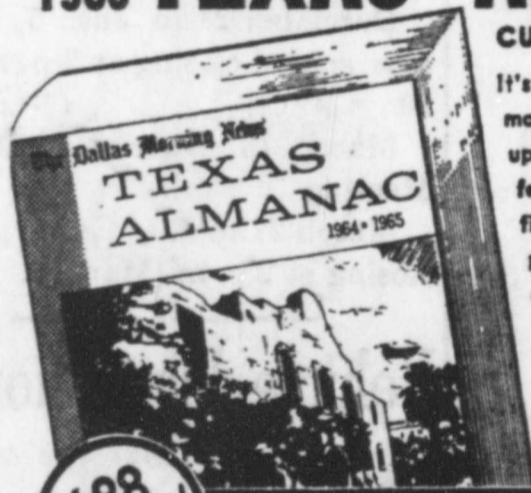

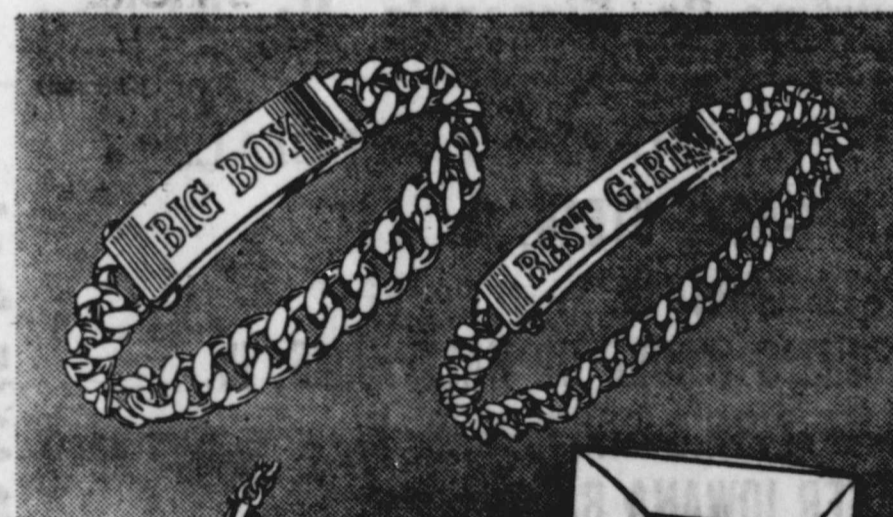
