January 1—Producers may begin requesting additional cotton acreage

January 24—Final day for filing application for new growers cotton allotments

January 31—Final day for filing application for payment on shorn wool and unshorn lamb.

January 31—Final day to make application for commodity loans.

February 17—Final day to disburse commodity loans.

February 10—Feed Grain sign-up begins.

March 27—Feed Grain sign-up closes.

March 31—Final day to redeem commodity loans

New Growers Cotton Allotments

The final date for making application for 1964 New Grower Cotton Allotments is January 24, 1964. If you have an interest in any other cotton farm as operator or owner you are not eligible as a new grower. You must expect to obtain more than 50% of your income from the production of agricultural commodities from this farm, excluding the estimated return from the production of the requested allotment to be eligible.

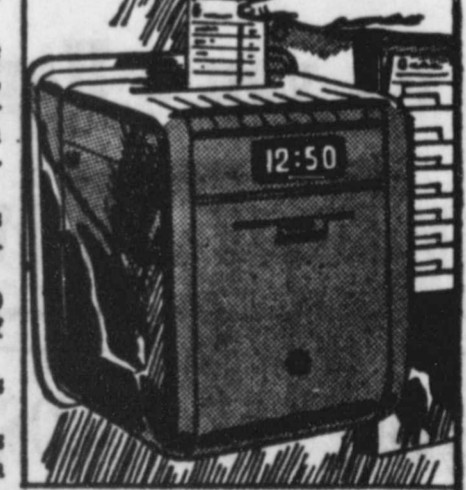
