The final date for bringing in proof of cotton production was Monday, June 15. This proof is being processed and when all work is completed, those of you who have proven your yield will be mailed an MQ-24, Upland Cotton Notice, on the revised yields and payment rates. Those who made regular appeals and did not bring in proof will be hearing from the County Committee as soon as they have reviewed the cases.

### WHEAT

Several Wheat Producers have been in to inquire about whether or not they will receive marketing cards. Let us clarify this by saying that since there are no marketing quotas or penalties this year, there will be no marketing cards issued.

### OATS AND RYE

If you have a wheat allotment on your farm and have harvested or will harvest any oats or rye for grain in 1964, please come into the office at your earliest convenience and give us your estimate on the acreage harvested. This information will be used as a factor in determining oat-rye bases for 1965. 1964 PERFORMANCE

We are in the process of preparing for the cotton, feed grain and diverted acres measurements. Actual work in the field is expected to begin sometime around the first part of July. As in the past, your continued cooperation with the reporters will be appreciated.

Austin, June 10—Speaker of the House Byron Tunnell today announced the appointment of Representative William S. (Bill) Heatly of Paducah to attend the annual Southern Regional Conference of the Council of State Governments.

Meeting in Sarasota, Florida, June 16-19 the Conference will be devoted to discussion on the issues of "Education and the Future Economic Development of the South," "Mental Health and Retardation," and the "Administration of Justice."

In appointing Representative Heatly to represent the State of Texas at the conference, Tunnell commented, "Representative Heatly's five terms of outstanding service in the Texas Legislature well qualify him to make invaluable contributions not only to the conference, but also to the State of Texas in bettering our interstate relations with the attending Southern States."

Speaker Tunnell who will head up the Texas delegation at the Conference, also appointed Representatives Ben Atwell of Dallas, Ben Barnes of DeLeon, and Gene Hendryx of Alpine, as delegates.

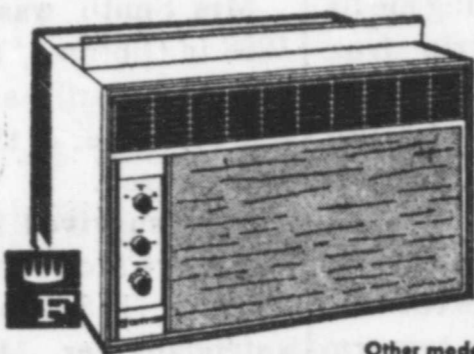

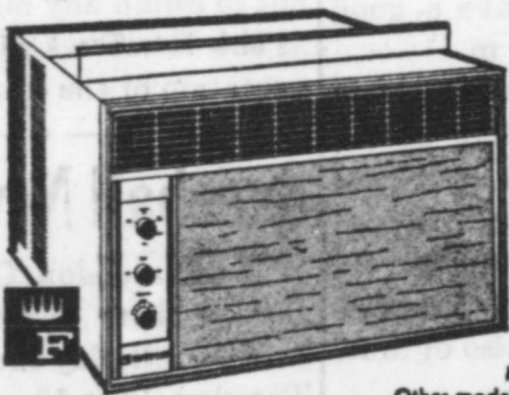

Throughout the state and nation, 4-H Club members are lining up to get on the conservation merry-go-round. A new 4-H Conservation program, recently announced by the National 4-H Service Committee, offers young people incentive awards. 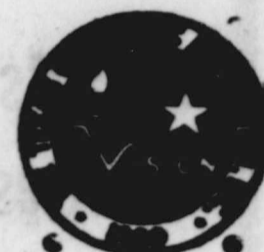

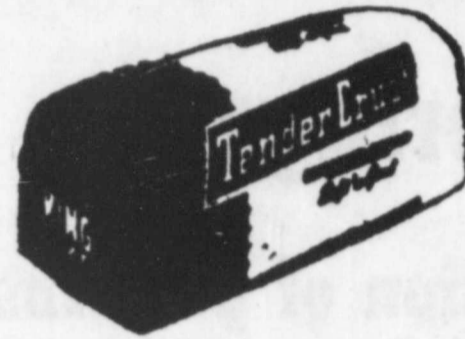
