## Youngblood Honored To Wed July 25

The ATC "Well Done Award" was presented to Capt. Adrain D. Youngblood, instructor pilot in Flight 7 of the 3500th PTS for professionalism and skill in saving a T-38 jet aircraft last Feb. 6, and in preventing injury to himself and his student.

The captain and his student were flying at about 340 mph 1,200 feet above the terrain with the student in control, when a duck crashed through the windscreen and hit the student in the face.

The windscreen was shattered, the standby magnetic compass was broken, the student's helmet was damaged and his sunvisor shattered, and blood, bird feathers and paper covered the interior of the front cockpit. Blood on the canopy hampered the captain's vision.

When the bird hit, the student momentarily loosened his grip on the control stick and the aircraft started a rolling motion. The student, thinking his instructor was injured, grabbed the stick and the captain had trouble getting control. Inter-cockpit communication was weak.

Captain Youngblood finally getting control, slowed to about 240 mph and directed the student to get low in the cockpit to avert the severe cold and wind. With impaired vision, the captain returned to Reese, obtained emergency clearance through heavy traffic and landed. His act saved the \$1 million aircraft and averted possible injury to himself and student. At the time the captain had 72 hours flying time in a T-38, of which 20 hours was with students.

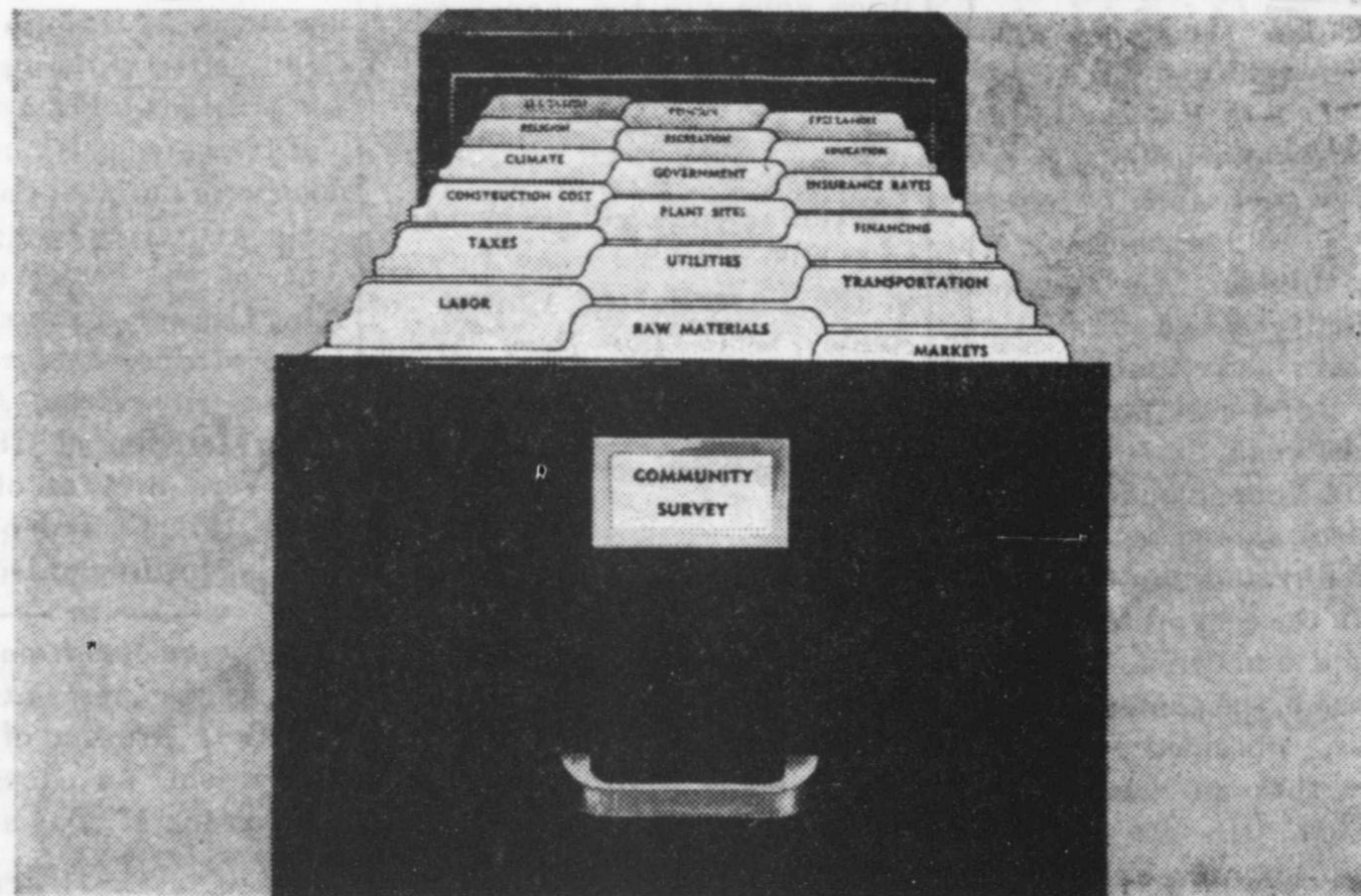

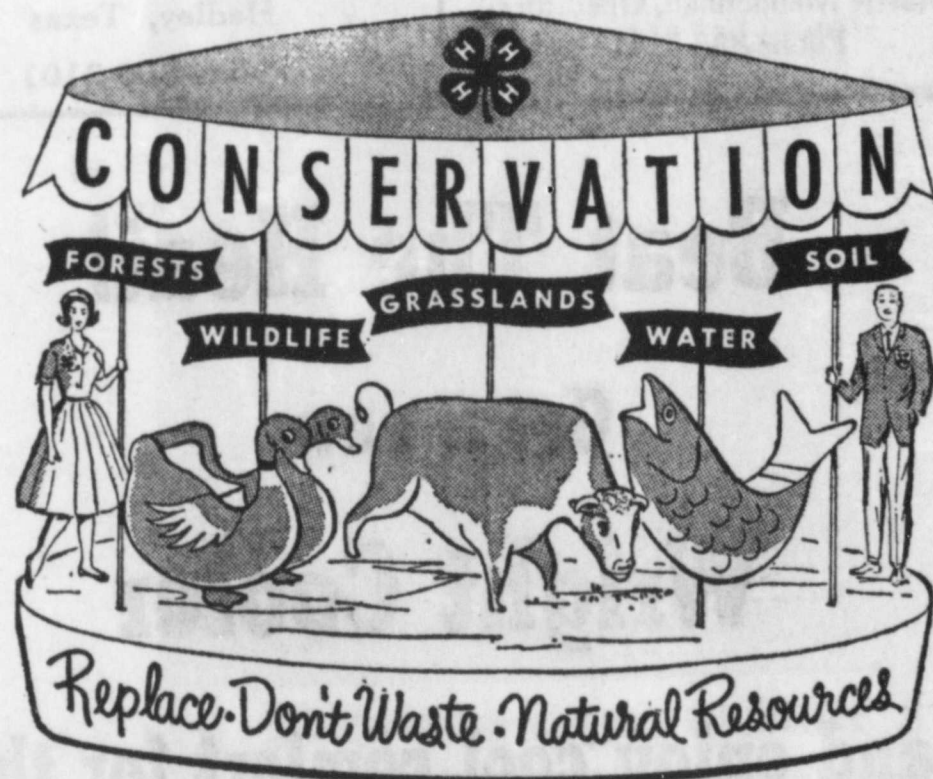

Throughout the state and nation, 4-H Club members are lining up to get on the conservation merry-go-round. They are eager to do their share of protecting and replacing the forests, wildlife, grasslands, water and soil that are either used up or destroyed. They deplore senseless misuse of nature's gifts.

A new 4-H Conservation program, recently announced by the National 4-H Service Committee, offers young people incentive awards. They are county conservation medals, a free trip for the state winner to the National 4-H Club Congress in Chicago, and \$500 college scholarships to the six top members chosen from all state winners.

The sponsor is John Deere, a long-time backer of 4-H Club work. The program is carried out under the supervision of the Cooperative Extension Service, county extension agents and local club leaders.

Winners in all categories will be announced at the close of the 1964 club year.

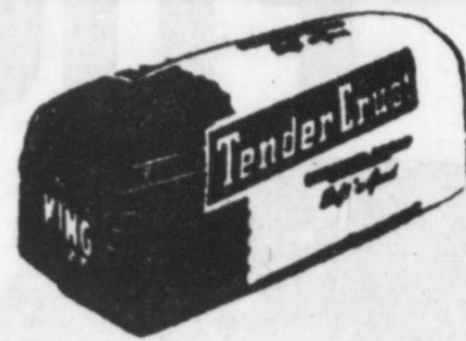
