Thursday night the Greenbelt directors put their official O. K. on the contract for the water line from Lake Creek to Quanah, a distance of 73 miles. The contract was let to the R. H. Fulton firm of Lubbock for \$3,041,302.20. Work is slated to start in 45 days and to be finished by June 1, 1965.

Indian Dancers

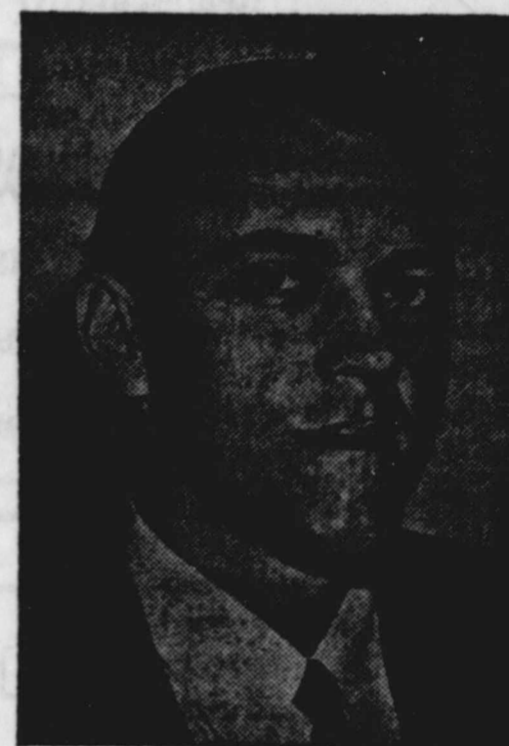

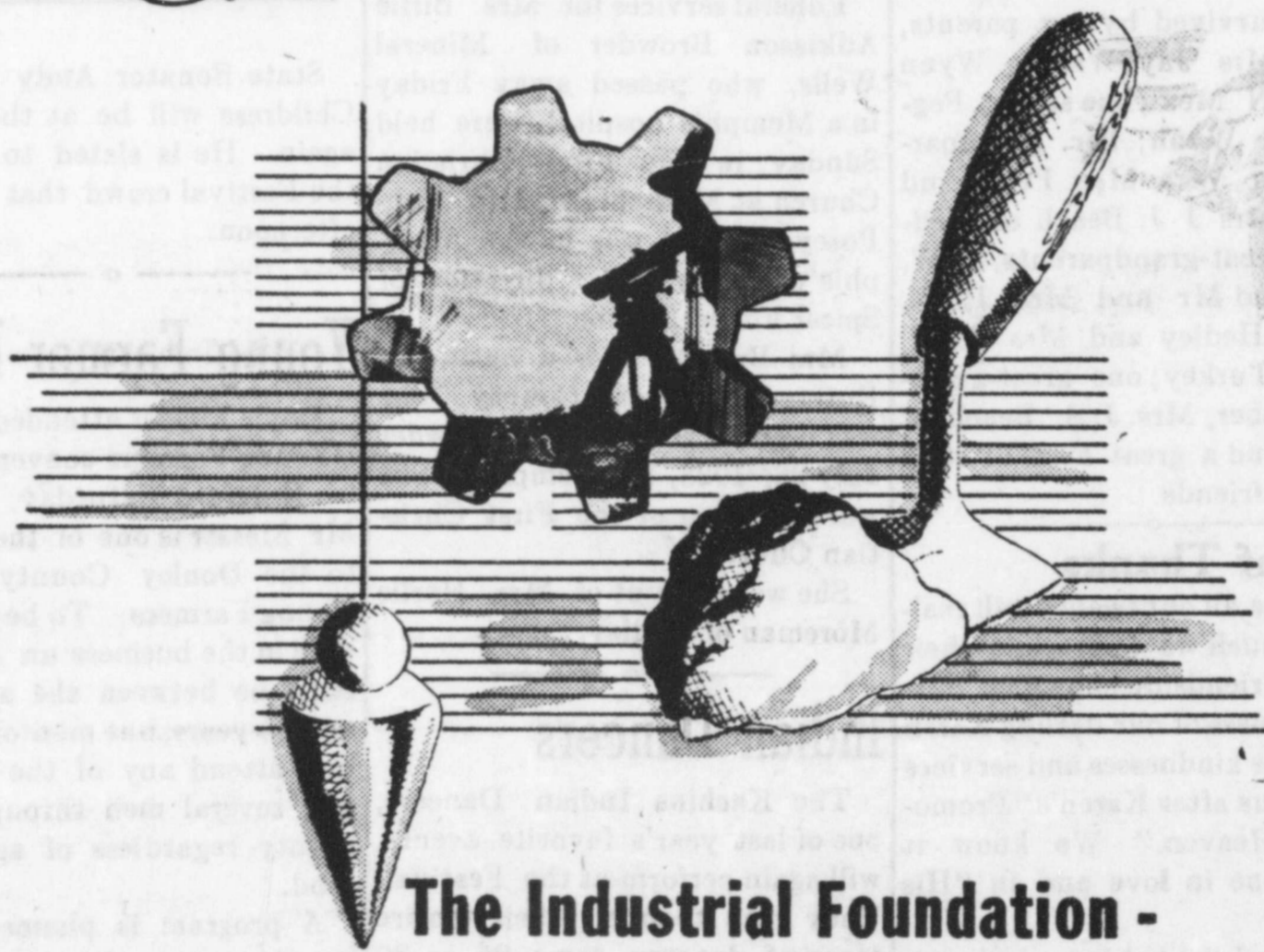

Vehicle Inspection

Austin—Col Homer Garrison Jr., director of the Texas Department of Public Safety, has announced that the time has arrived for Texas motorists to have their vehicles inspected again.

Garrison said Sept. 1 marked the beginning of the 1965 vehicle inspection period as prescribed by the Public Safety Commission. As in previous years, the period will end on April 15, 1965.

"This means that between now and April 15, 1965, more than 5,200,000 Texas registered vehicles will have to be inspected at the 5,200 official inspection stations in Texas," he said.

Garrison urged motorists to have their vehicles inspected in the routine visits to garages for ordinary maintenance and repairs and thereby eliminate the necessity of having to wait in line at a later date for an inspection sticker.

To Dove Hunters

Don Peeples, chairman of the Amarillo Racing Pigeon Club, requests that all sportsmen in this area please take care not to shoot a racing pigeon while dove hunting. The pigeons sometimes try to group with doves, but are sufficiently different in appearance that sportsmen should have no difficulty in identifying them.

Shooting these pigeons is a violation of both state and federal laws.

Hunters are also reminded that the shooting hours for mourning dove are from noon until sunset. The daily limit is 12 and the possession limit is 24. The north zone season is from Sept. 1 to Oct. 30.

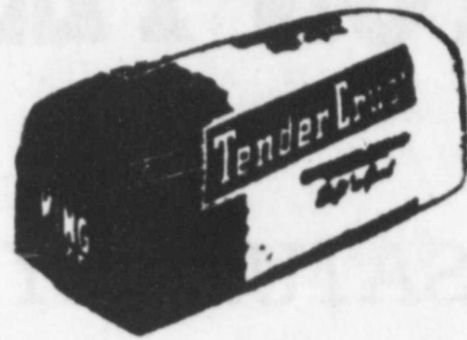
