At the close of the very interesting and entertaining program, Ricki Rowell was named as the incom ing Cotton Festival Queen, and was crowned by District Governor James Wheeler of Amarillo. All twelve of these lovely girls should be commended for their wonderful work in selling tickets. They raised a total of $\$ 2,53782$, which is a new record for Cotton Festival ticket sales
