Official Memorandum

Greetings:

Special observance of increased emphasis on our education system has been marked annually for fifteen years by a Public Schools Week in Texas.

During this period, parents are encouraged to visit the public schools, and all citizens are urged through special programs to recognize the tremendous importance of our system of education. Our goal is to make Texas public schools the finest in the Nation, and to achieve this our citizens are urged to take an active interest in the school systems and to cooperate with their school boards, superintendents, principals and teachers.

Never before in our history has there been a greater need for educated leadership. As we rush to train young people in science and technology to keep pace with world events, it is also important to remember that our public schools will furnish our tomorrow's leaders with the basic human, moral and spiritual foundations necessary for more advanced training and knowledge.

Therefore, I, as Governor of Texas, do hereby designate the period of March 1-5, 1965, as **PUBLIC SCHOOLS WEEK** in Texas.

Pesticide Survey

A survey of pesticides used by farmers and how they are used, will be made in Donley County during February and March, according to Cary D. Palmer, State Statistician, Texas Crop and Livestock Reporting Service.

Donley County is one of 400 counties in the U. S. included in a national study of farm uses of pesticides. The results will be used to help assess the economic impact of present and future uses of chemical control measures. This study the first of its kind, is part of the USDA research program to develop more effective and safer pest control methods.

Mrs. Gertrude S. Christal of Lelia Lake will interview farmers in Donley County, starting on February 15. She will be working under the supervision of the Texas Crop and Livestock Reporting Service.

it may be reapportioned to farmers requesting additional cotton acreage. Cotton may be released for one year, or may be released permanently. Acreage reapportioned to other farms is on a year to year basis and does not affect the cotton history for the farm.

**Move To Save
Prairie Chicken**

Contributions are being requested to help make a down payment on about 3,600 acres of land near Eagle Lake in Colorado County as a refuge for the Att-water prairie chicken. There are about 1,335 of these prairie chickens left about 400 of them on the proposed refuge. The birds once numbered a million or more.

The Texas Prairie Chicken Committee has an option on the land for the proposed refuge, but the option expires Feb 18. About \$20,000 has been raised for the project, but \$50,000 more is needed by Feb 18 to complete the down payment.

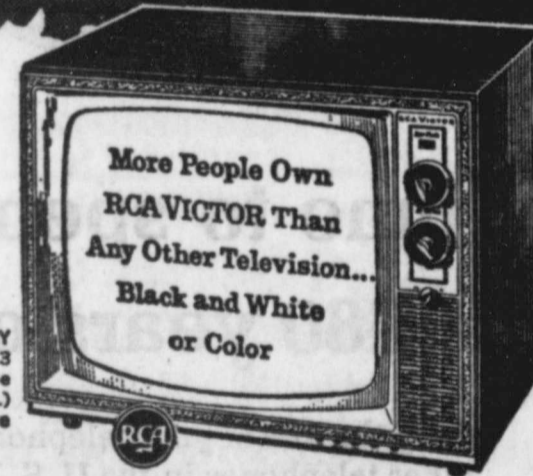

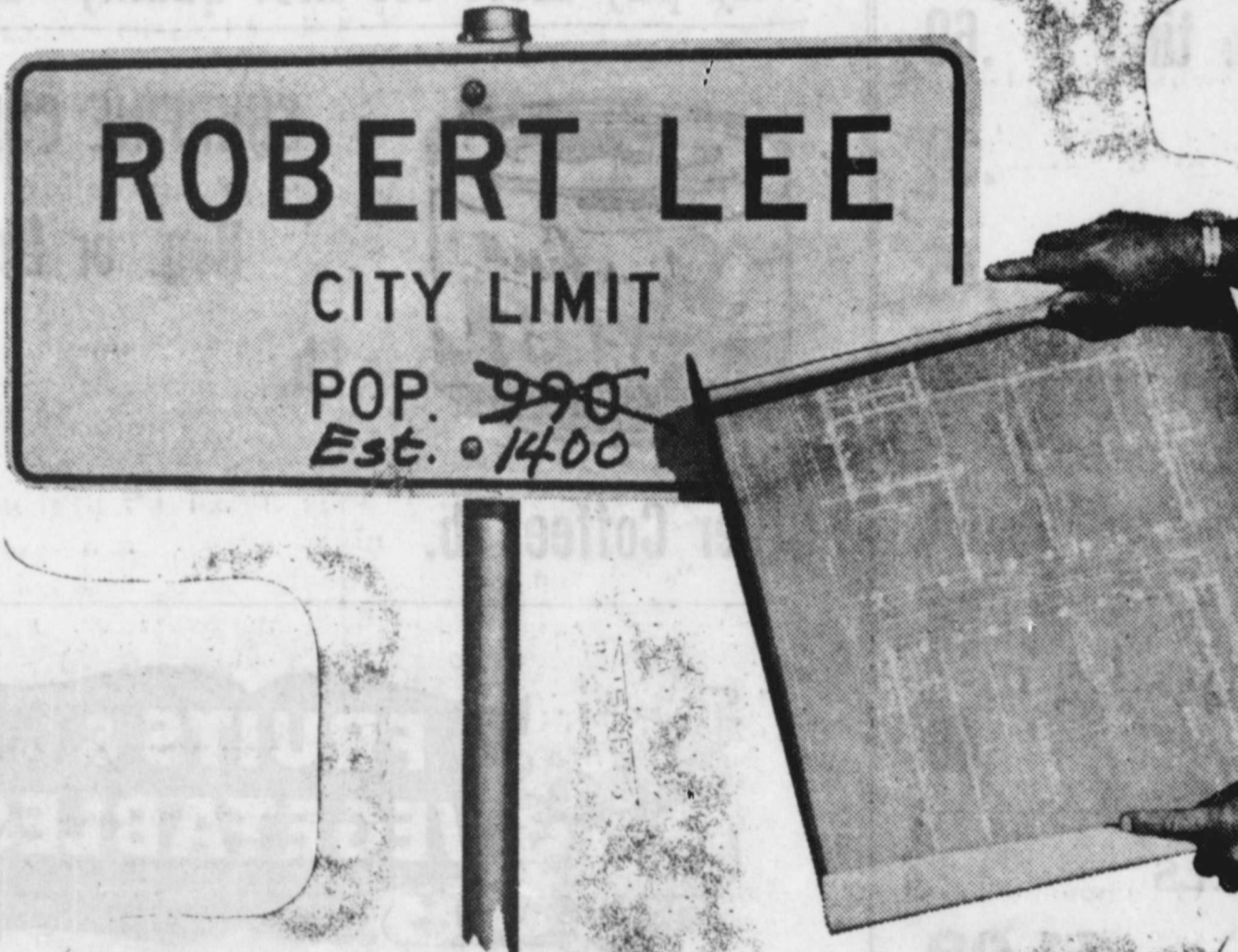

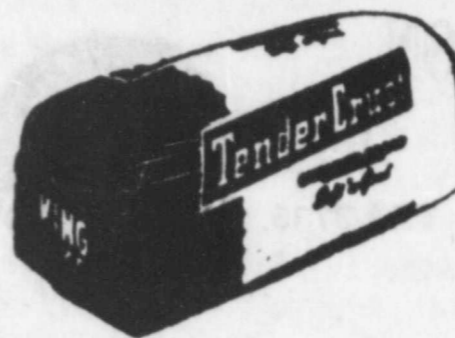
