Cotton Classing Offices Under New Agency

The Secretary of Agriculture Orville L. Freeman, announced that a new agency, the Consumer and Marketing Service, would become effective immediately. The Consumer and Marketing Service will perform all the present functions of the Agricultural Marketing Service, plus related operating programs in other USDA agencies.

Among the agencies affected will be the Cotton Division Classing Office at Altus, Oklahoma, and the seasonal sub-office at Memphis, Texas, according to C. E. Cox, officer in charge at Altus.

The Memphis seasonal sub-office was opened in 1959, with an expanded territory made up of nine Texas counties from the Altus area and nine counties from the Lubbock territory. During the past six years the Memphis Office has classed an average of more than 200,000 bales per year, for a total of a little over 1,200,000 bales.

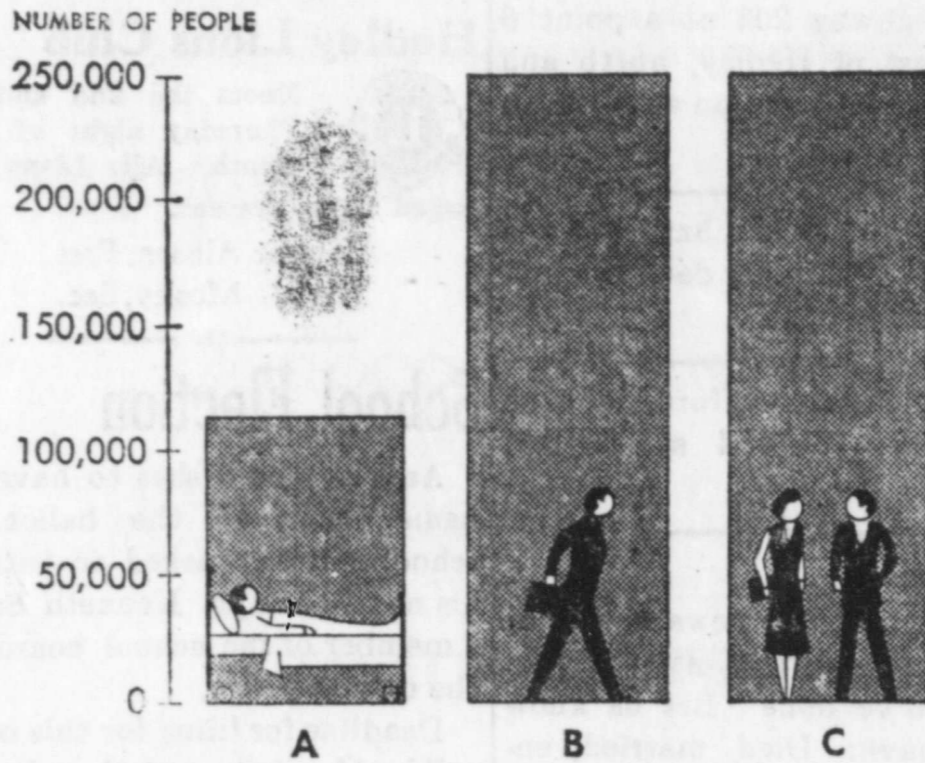

TB: the Problem that Won't Go Away

610,000 Americans still have active tuberculosis or are classified as "high risk" individuals.



- A. 110,000 are known to have active tuberculosis.
- B. 250,000 are recently recovered TB patients, many of whom are subject to relapse.
- C. 250,000 are known to have had contact with new active TB cases recently reported.

610,000 persons, all told, are now in the TB picture—either as actively ill patients or in the "high risk" category. Christmas Seal funds help provide the hope and the means of achieving ultimate control and eradication of tuberculosis in the U. S.

Farmers who do not intend to plant all of their allotment are urged to release such acreage to the County Committee, so that it may be reapportioned to farmers requesting additional cotton acreage. Cotton may be released for one year, or may be released permanently. Acreage reapportioned to other farms is on a year to year basis and does not affect the cotton history for the farm.

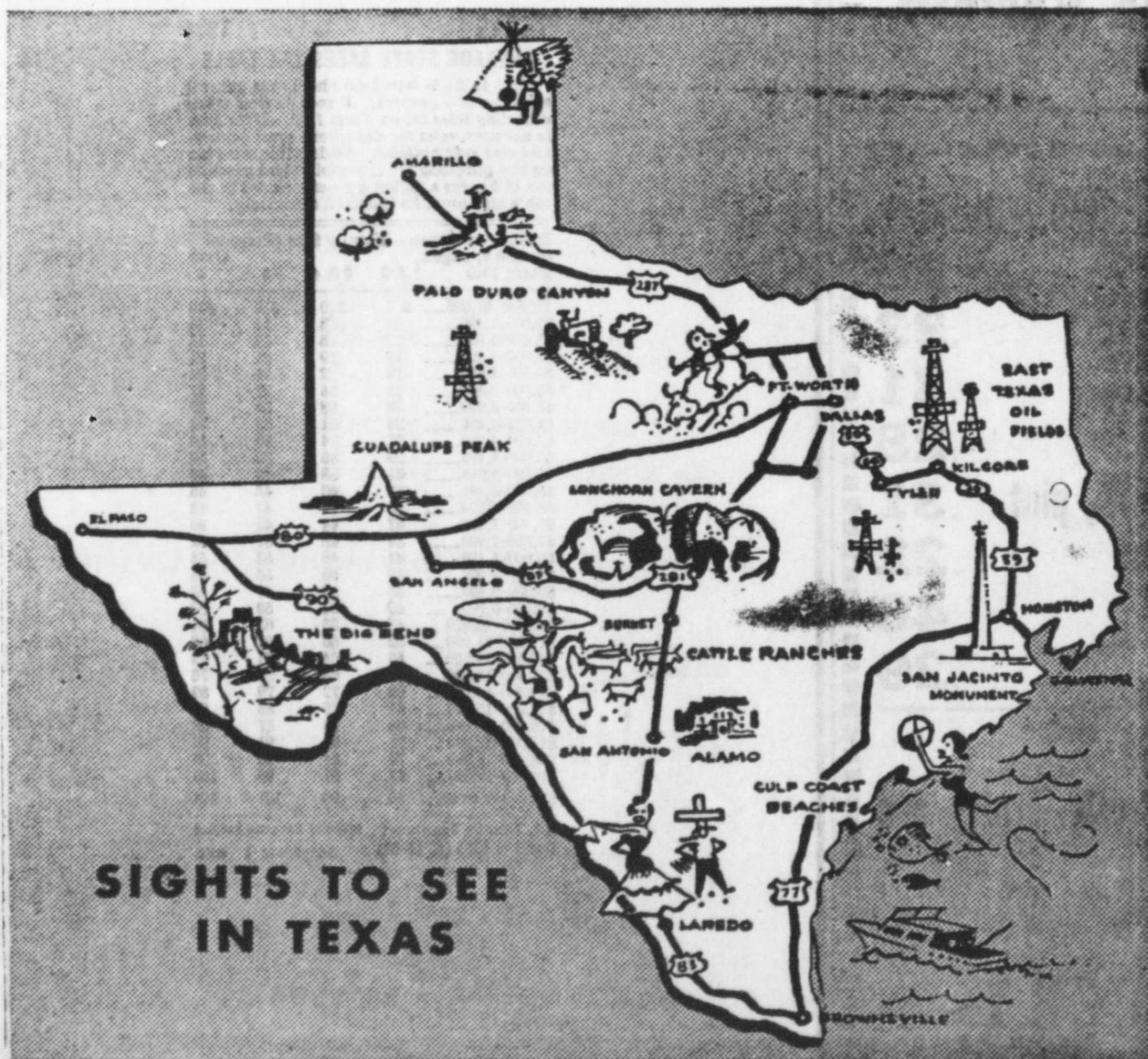

Pesticide Survey

A survey of pesticides used by farmers and how they are used, will be made in Donley County during February and March, according to Cary D. Palmer, State Statistician, Texas Crop and Livestock Reporting Service.

Donley County is one of 400 counties in the U. S. included in a national study of farm uses of pesticides. The results will be used to help assess the economic impact of present and future uses of chemical control measures. This study the first of its kind, is part of the USDA research program to develop more effective and safer pest control methods.

Mrs. Gertrude S. Christal of Lelia Lake will interview farmers in Donley County, starting on February 15. She will be working under the supervision of the Texas Crop and Livestock Reporting Service.

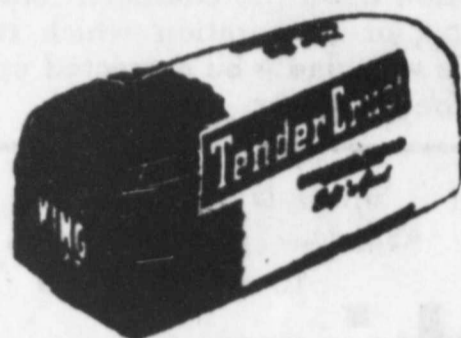
