Greenbelt Dam

The Gilvin and Terrell firm of Amarillo had the low bid for the diversion works on Lake Creek northwest of here. Their bid was \$38,572. The highest bid received was \$66,660.

Bids are being studied by the Authority's engineers and the contract is expected to be let at the next meeting of the Board of directors March 11.

The 18 inch pipe line is about completed from Childress to Quanah and the 21 inch pipe line is now in Hall County and is expected to proceed this way very rapidly.

Other work is progressing according to schedule. Work on the 2 million gallon above ground reservoir here is slated to begin the latter part of March. Probably the next contract up for bids will be the dam on the river 4 miles north of Clarendon.

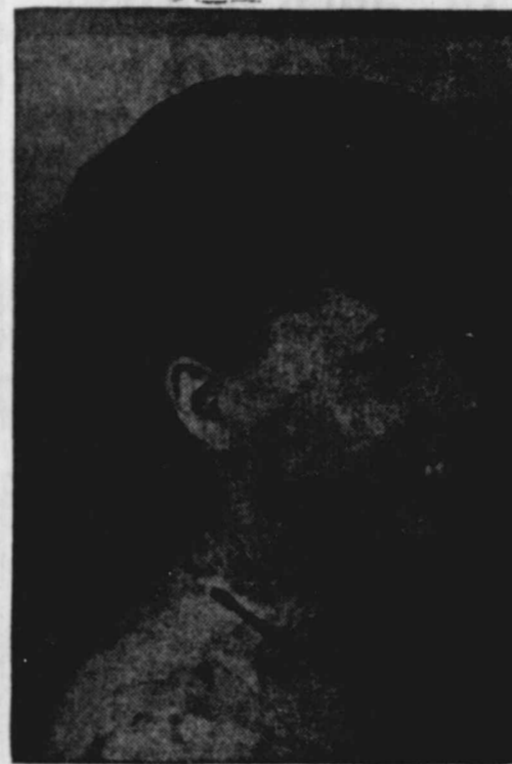

Vehicle Inspection

There will be no extension of the Motor Vehicle Safety Inspection deadline of April 15, 1965, announced Captain Alan Johnson of the Motor Vehicle Inspection Service, Texas Department of Public Safety, for this area.

'Only two million of the five and a quarter million registered vehicles in Texas have been inspected. This leaves over three million vehicles to be inspected in about five weeks,' said Captain Johnson. Many thousands of vehicle owners can expect to wait in long lines in order to get their vehicles inspected by the April 15 deadline.

Bureau of the Census has just reported after tabulating data gathered from all firms in the 1963 census of business. The last previous business census conducted by the Census Bureau, an agency of the U. S. Dept. of Commerce, was in 1958.

Retail trade in the county meant jobs (exclusive of proprietors) for 202 men and women and a yearly payroll of \$553,000.

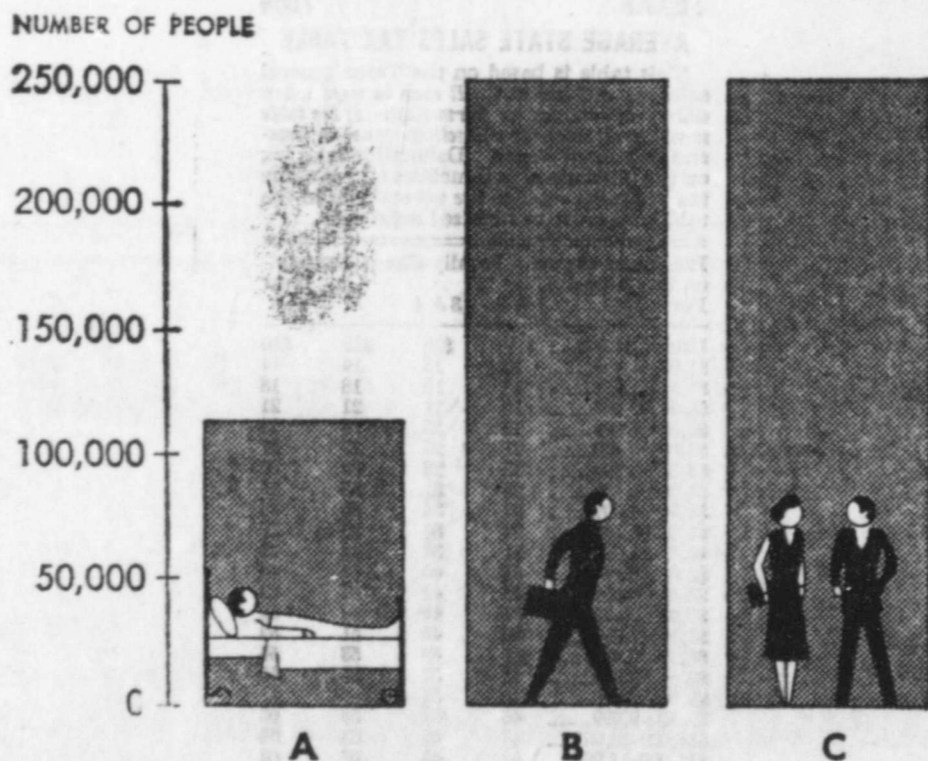

TB: the Problem that Won't Go Away

610,000 Americans still have active tuberculosis or are classified as "high risk" individuals.



- A. 110,000 are known to have active tuberculosis.
- B. 250,000 are recently recovered TB patients, many of whom are subject to relapse.
- C. 250,000 are known to have had contact with new active TB cases recently reported.

610,000 persons, all told, are now in the TB picture—either as actively ill patients or in the "high risk" category. Christmas Seal funds help provide the hope and the means of achieving ultimate control and eradication of tuberculosis in the U. S.

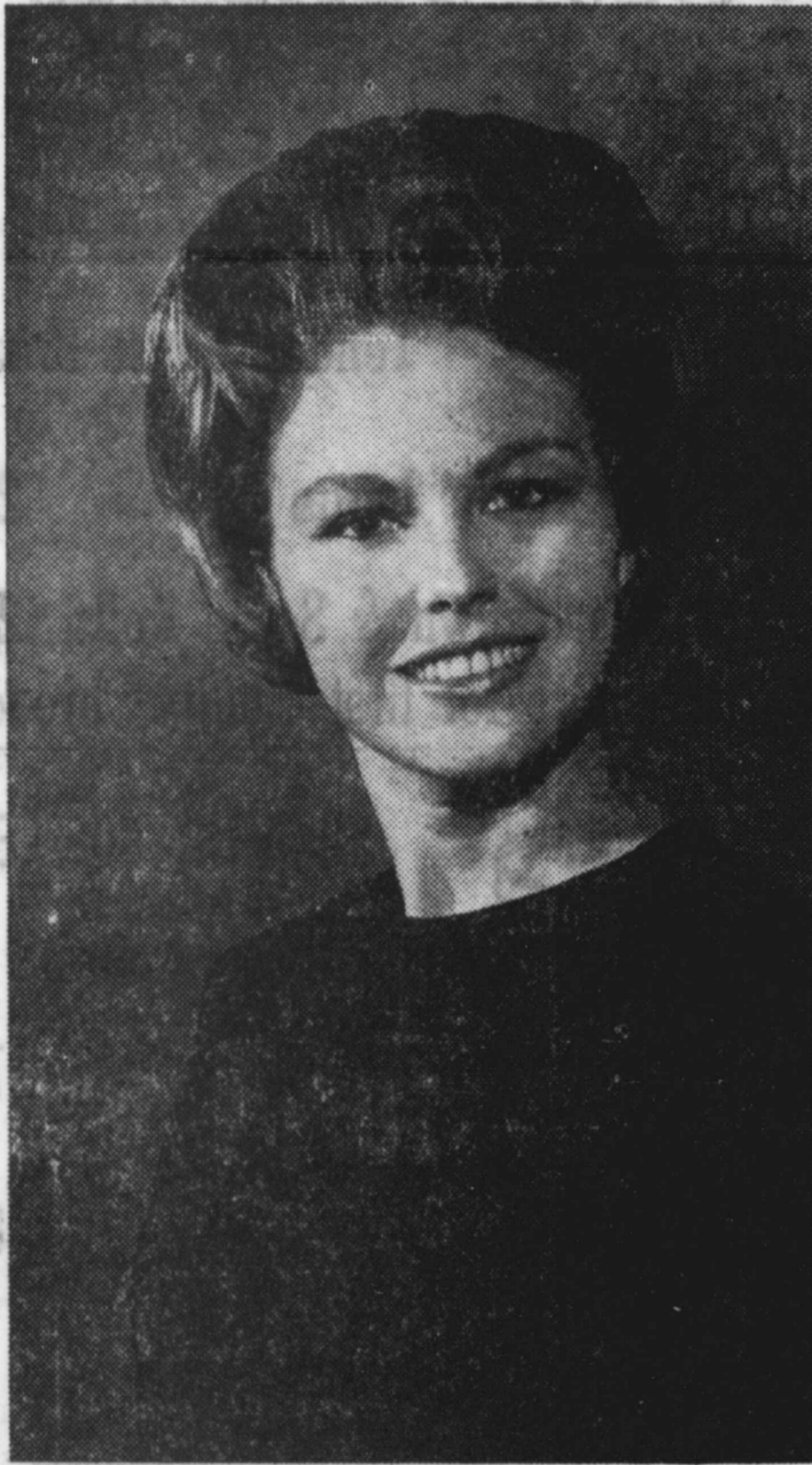

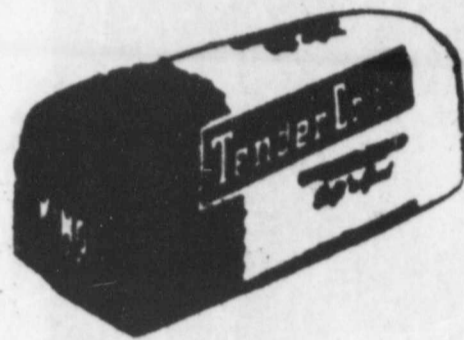
