Greenbelt Dam

Local director Clifford Johnson attended a meeting of the board of directors of the Greenbelt Water Authority last Thursday night. The contract on the pump station was awarded to the low bidder, Gilvin and Terrell of Amarillo, for \$38,572.

Two pumps for the station were purchased. One will be a 50 horsepower pump and one will be 100 horsepower. The costs of the pumps were \$4,830.66. They will be capable of pumping three million gallons of water a day.

Bids will be opened at 9 a. m. March 18 for the foundation of the two million gallon water tank here. Contract for the tank has already been let and work is slated to start in April.

The pipeline has been laid from Quanah to Estelline and and pipe has been strung out almost to Memphis. They expect to be in Donley County in about two weeks.

Hedley Receives 5% Fire Credit

The City of Hedley will receive an additional 5% good fire record credit that will apply to fire insurance policies written after April 1, 1965.

That with the 10% credit we already have gives insurers in the city limits a total 15% credit from the regular rates.

Much credit goes to our efficient wholly volunteer fire department, however the City Council helping to keep the city clean, the citizens who keep their property clean, fire prevention taught in our schools, and other ways of preventing fires, has helped a lot.

Retail Sales

Donley County's 87 retail establishments had \$6,600,000 in sales in 1963, an increase of 6% from 1958, the U. S. Bureau of the Census has just reported after tabulating data gathered from all firms in the 1963 census of business. The last previous business census conducted by the Census Bureau, an agency of the U. S. Dept. of Commerce, was in 1958.

Retail trade in the county meant jobs (exclusive of proprietors) for 202 men and women and a yearly payroll of \$553,000.

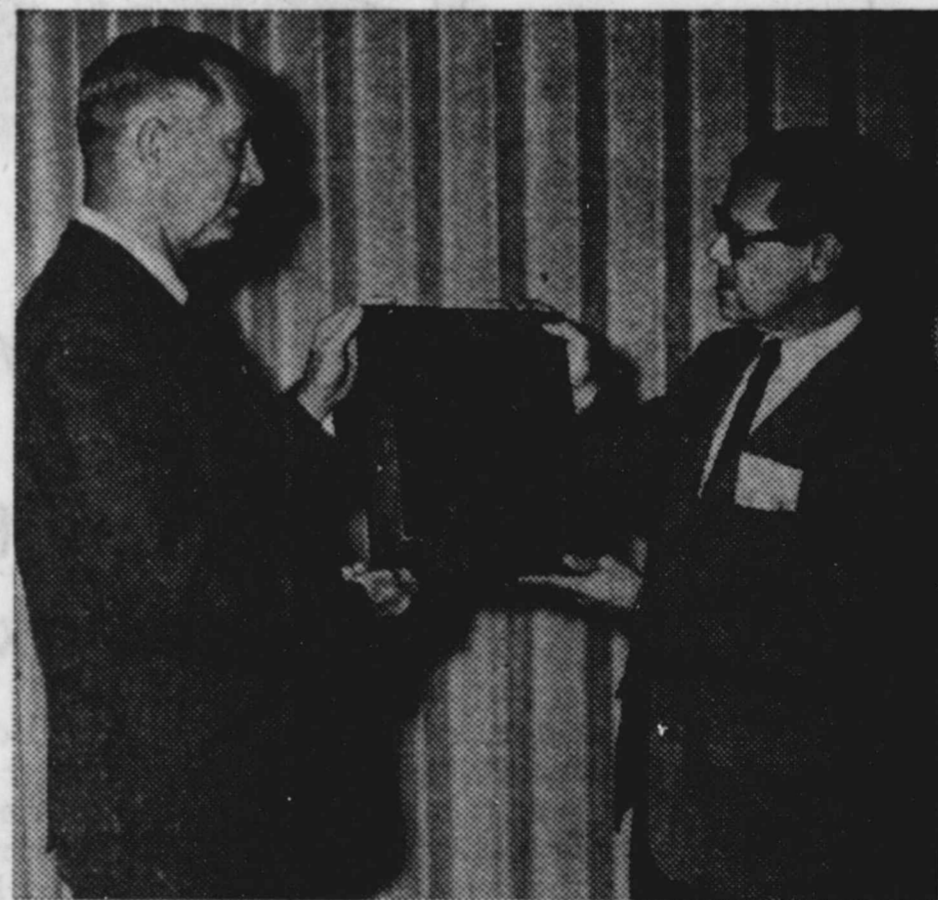

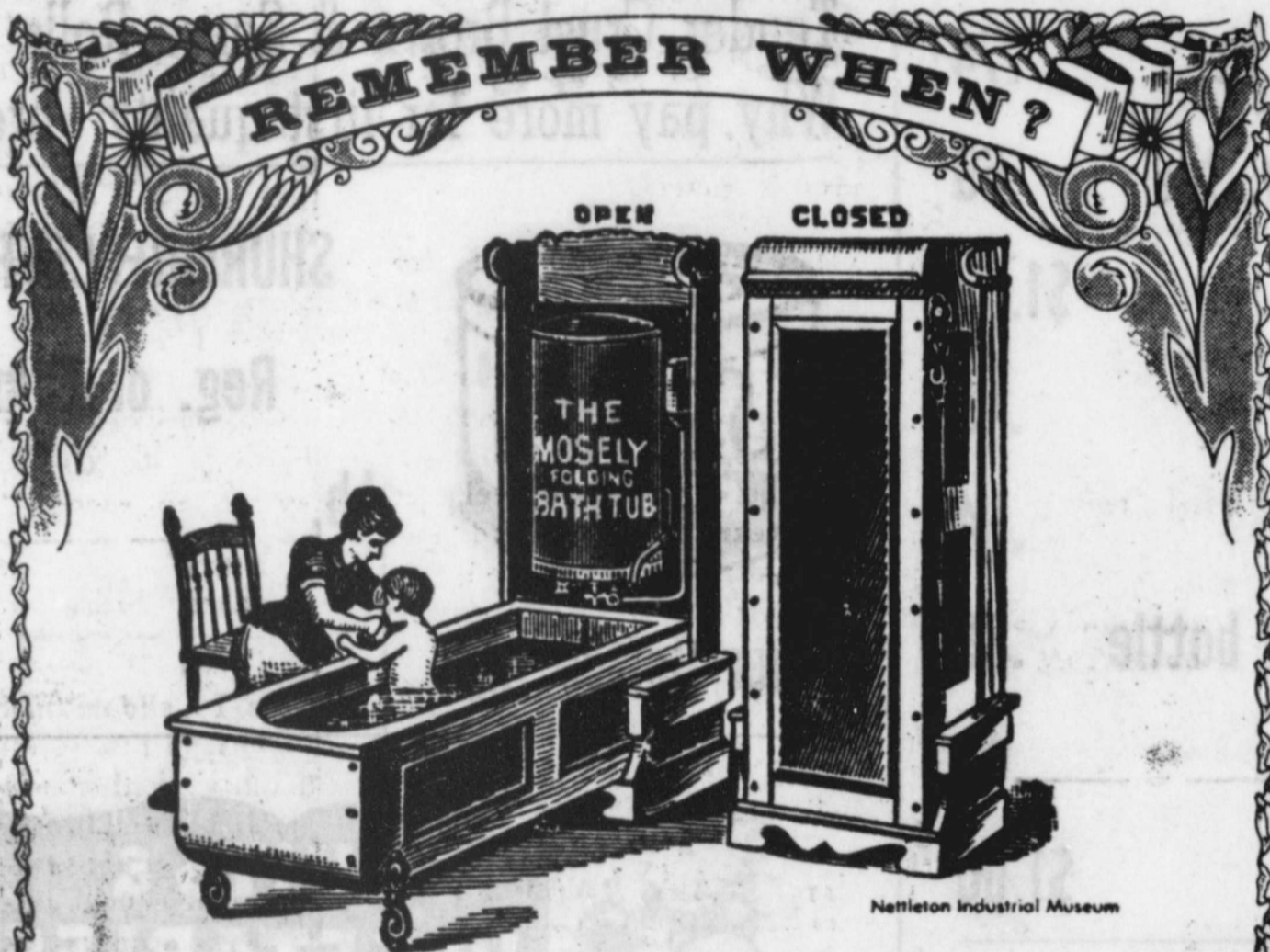

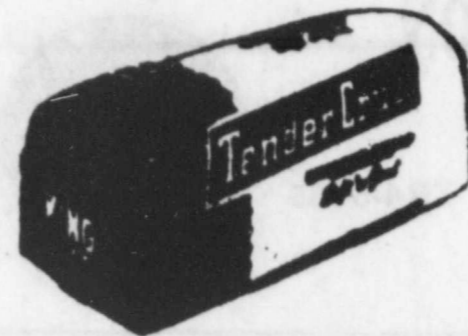
