Donley County cattlemen are invited to attend a beef cattle meeting Friday March 26, at the Bull Barn in Hereford at 9:30 a. m.

Ronald Gooch, County Agent, said the program would feature Dr. Jan Bonsma, an internationally known animal scientist from South Africa.

"Dr. Bonsma has created wide interest among ranchers in his methods of visual appraisal of cattle for their ability to produce good calves," Gooch said. "He calls the process functional efficiency, or judging fertility of cattle by detecting visible abnormalities."

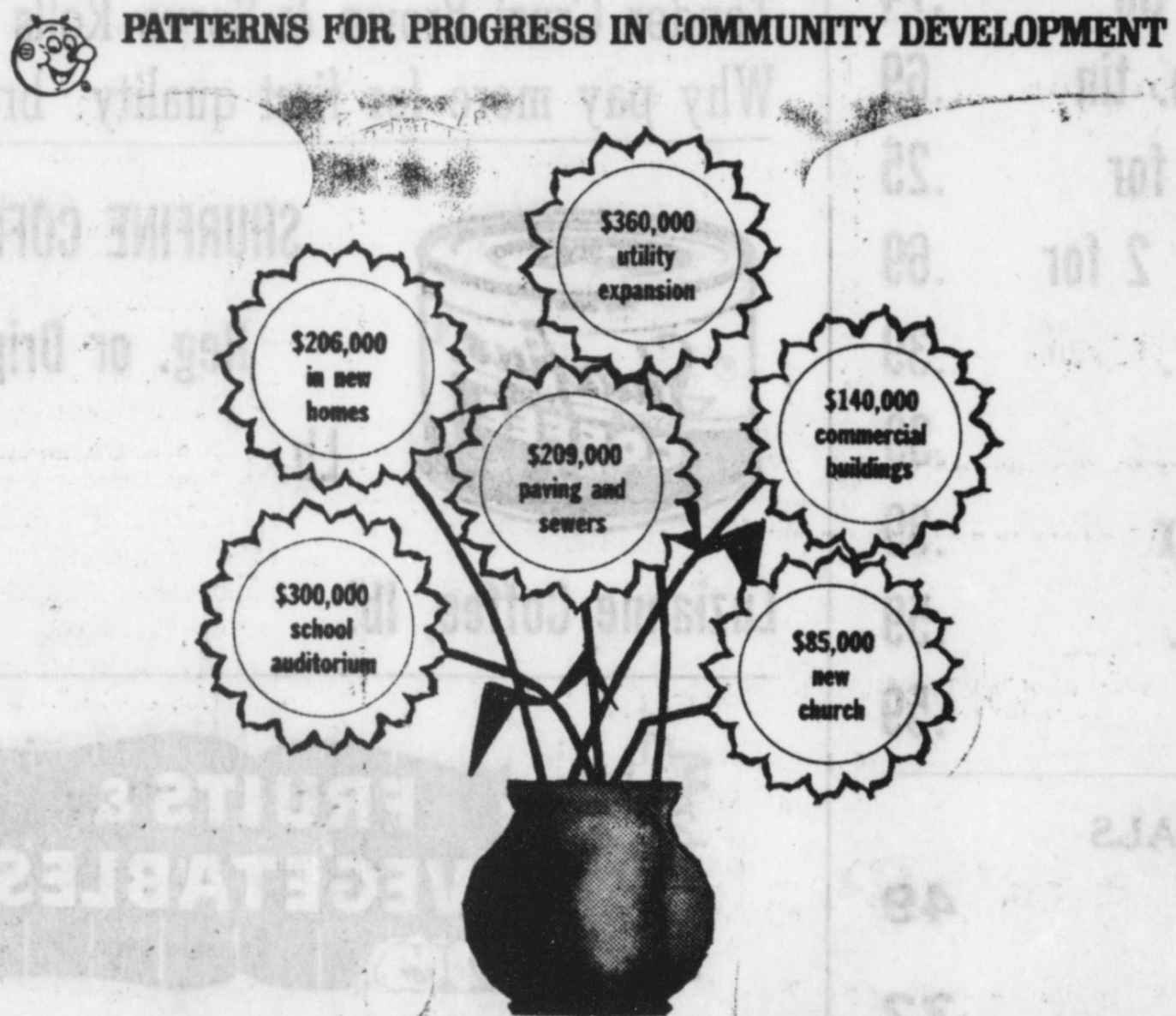

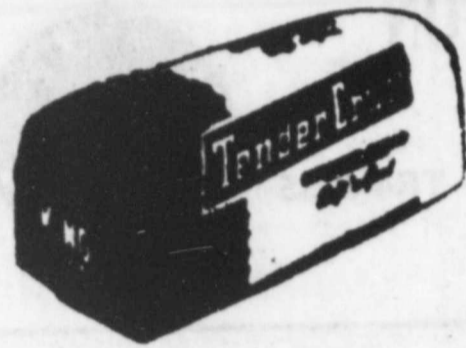
