Business Census

Donley County's 36 service establishments had total receipts of \$363,000 in 1963, a decrease of 20% from 1958, according to a report of the 1963 census of business just released by the Bureau of Census, U. S. Dept. of Commerce. The last previous census covered operations during 1958.

The service trades in the census of business included those providing personal services to individuals, miscellaneous business services, auto repair and other repair services, amusement and recreation services and hotels and motels.

The selected service trade establishments in the county employed 30 persons exclusive of proprietors, and had a payroll for the year of \$62,000.

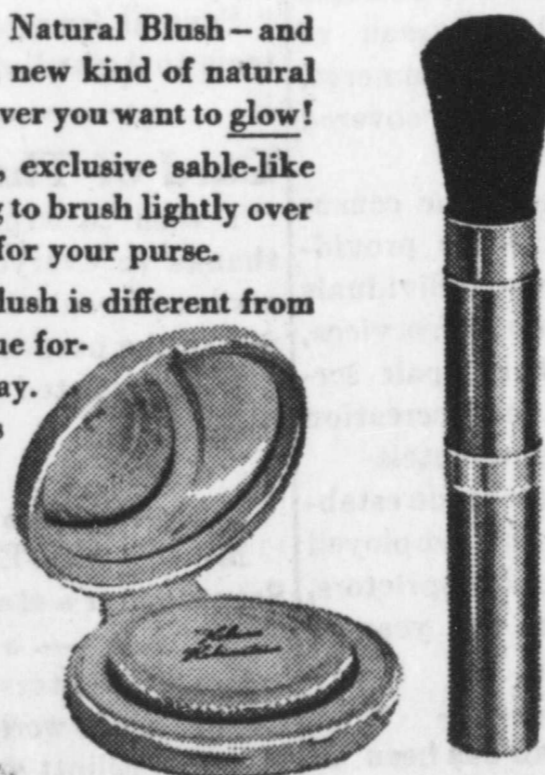

News From Our County Agent

Donley County livestock producers contributed \$1,566.65 for the screwworm eradication program, during the recent fund raising drive. This exceeded the county goal of \$1,296. The Donley County Animal Health Committee, made up of local ranchers, served as the collection committee in the county

The Southwest Animal Health Research Foundation, which is in charge of the screwworm eradication program, announced last week that the state goal of \$300,000 had been exceeded. This will insure the continued operation of the screwworm eradication program at an effective level through July 1.

Local livestock producers are urged to watch their livestock for screwworm infestations, as the screwworm has made its appearance back in Texas. Eighteen screwworm cases were reported in Texas during April. Mailing tubes can be picked up at the County Agent's office for use in sending in any samples that might be screwworms.

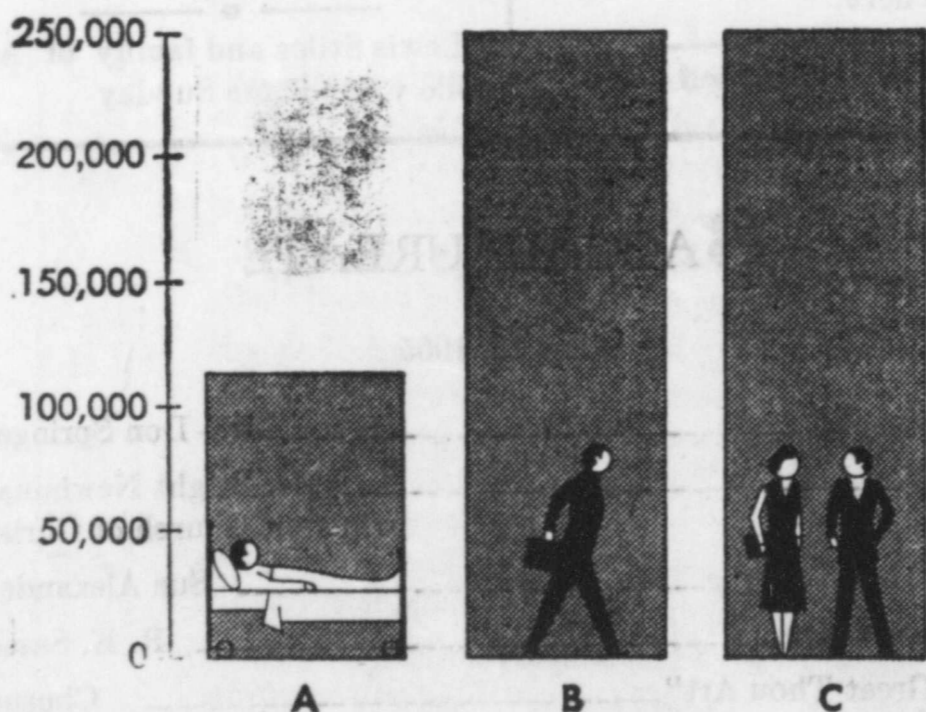

610,000 Americans still have active tuberculosis or are classified as "high risk" individuals.

- A. 110,000 are known to have active tuberculosis.
- B. 250,000 are recently recovered TB patients, many of whom are subject to relapse.
- C. 250,000 are known to have had contact with new active TB cases recently reported.

610,000 persons, all told, are now in the TB picture—either as actively ill patients or in the "high risk" category. Christmas Seal funds help provide the hope and the means of achieving ultimate control and eradication of tuberculosis in the U. S.

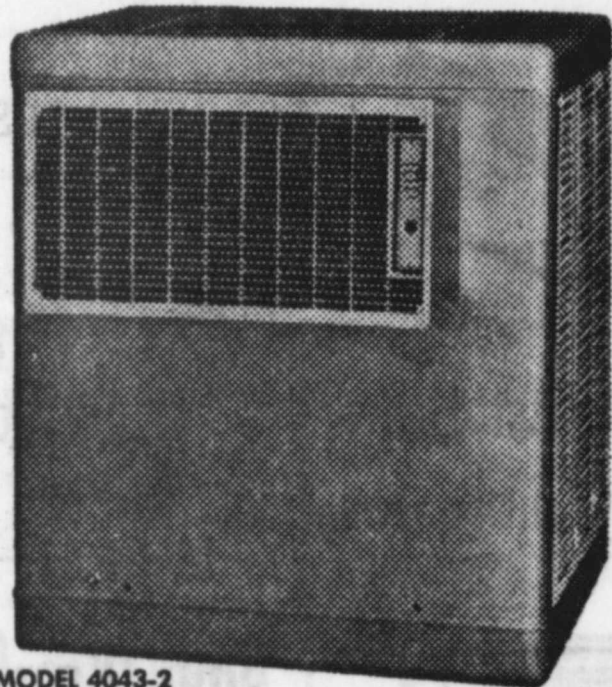

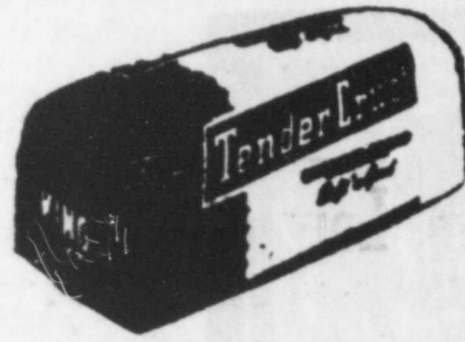
