Melodrama at Hall County Celebration

As a part of the Hall County Jubilee celebration Sept 18 and 19, an outdoor dramatic production is planned for Saturday evening's entertainment. An early day street scene complete with wooden fronted stores will be the setting for Sagebrush Saga, a melodrama of pioneer times in the Texas Panhandle to be presented Saturday evening, Sept 18, in the Memphis city park amphitheatre.

The rhyming narration of Sagebrush Saga will be ably delivered by John Binkley as the players in colorful costumes of the era move through the story. Since music is essential to a good production, Letha Springer of Hedley as the saloon soubrette, aided by the bartender, Ronnie Leach, the barber, Roger Hargrove, a dance hall girl, Elmonette Branigan, the banker, Carl Yancey, the gambler, Johnny Harrell Deadeye Dora, Patsy Morris, with Zip Durrett of Lakeview on guitar will regale their listeners with such old favorites as "Red Wing," "Bird in a Gilded Cage," etc. The Hall County Singers will do the hymn singing.

The main show will begin at 8:00 p. m., but there will be thirty minutes of breakdown fiddle music furnished by J. B. Yates of Hedley with Jack Pritchard and Ray David of Clarendon from 7 to 7:30 p. m., and thirty minutes of popular music by Jeral Rapp and Ted Bruce of Estelline from 7:30 to 8.

Admission will be \$1 for adults and 50¢ for students. The Business and Professional Women's Club will have charge of ticket sales. Tickets will go on sale Monday, Sept. 13. Get your ticket and don't dare miss this colorful extravaganza of square dancing, hymn singing music and mayhem.

Greenbelt Dam

The City of Childress purchased 18 million gallons of water from the Greenbelt Authority last month and the City of Quanah 25 million gallons. Quanah is now securing all its water from the Greenbelt but Childress is using some water from the city's wells. Johnny Conatser, Roger Messer and Johnny Leathers operate the pump station on Lake Creek.

Bids for the construction of the automatic control of the pipe line and control building in Hedley were opened at Childress at 2 p. m. last Thursday. The apparent low bidder was the Amco Electric Co. of Lubbock for \$86,535. The letting of this contract will complete the first phase of the \$11 million Greenbelt project. About \$4 million was spent to complete the first phase.

Clifford Johnson, local director, will attend the meeting of the board at Childress Thursday night. They will OK this bid and advertise for bids on the dam north of Clarendon. This will be the first step in the second phase which will include the dam, the building of the filter plant, the pipe line from the dam to Lake Creek, to Clarendon, and from Quanah to Crowell.

It's time for farmers and ranchers to file their claim for refund of federal tax on gasoline used for farming and ranching purposes, says County Agent Ronald Gooch. This claim will be allowed only if filed on or before Sept. 30, 1965. The period covered by this claim is from July 1, 1964, through June 30, 1965.

Any farmer or rancher needing Form 2240, which is used in filing for the tax refund, can obtain them by contacting the County Agent's office.

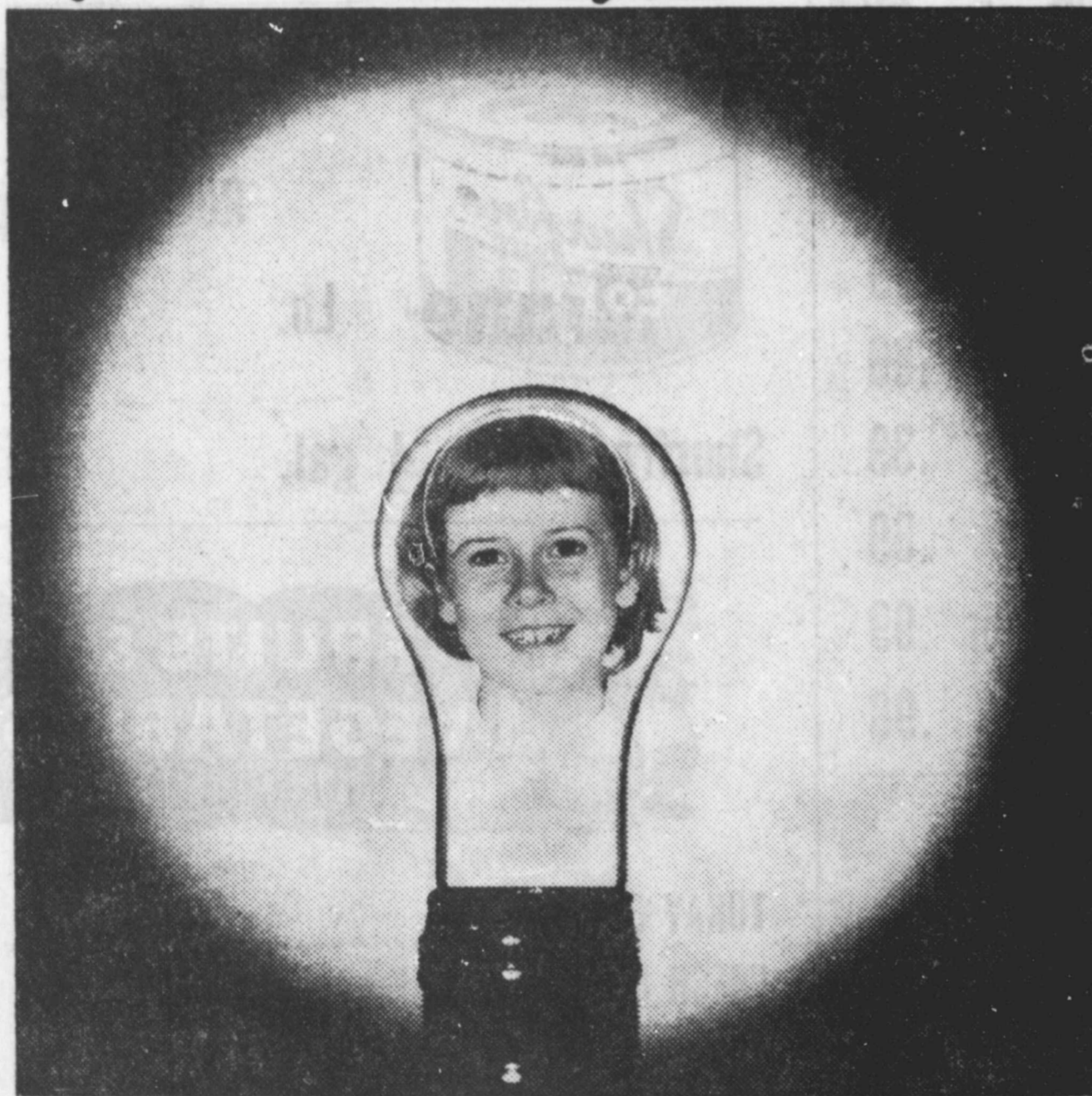

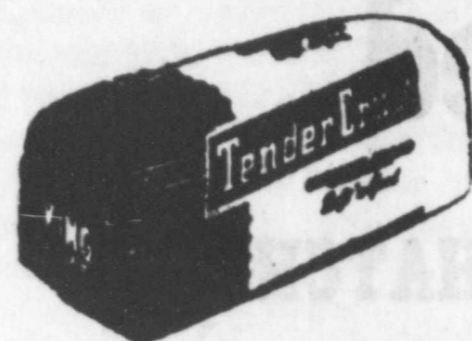
