Cotton Festival Is Great Success; Jamie Evans Is New Queen

The 14th annual Hedley Cotton Festival held last Friday and Saturday was a great success. Saturday morning rain threatened, but held off during the afternoon and allowed one of the best parades ever.

er ambulance, the Painter children's wagon, the Hedley Riding Club, the Harold White cart and the Civil Defense jeep.

Many comments were heard on the excellence of the parade for a town the size of Hedley, and it was indeed a parade of which any town might be proud. All of those who worked on these floats and cars are to be highly commended for their efforts.

The Moffitt Hardware float won first for business floats, the First Baptist Church won first for organizations, the Hedley Cafe won first for cars, and the Security State Bank won first for overall floats.

In the junior high band contest Clarendon junior high won first and McLean junior high second.

The climax of the Festival was the crowning of the new Queen in the new school building. An excellent program had been arranged by Mrs. Letha Springer, and emceed by Gene Allison, in honor of the outgoing Queen, Ricki Rowell. Rev. W. E. Lynn, president of the Hedley Lions Club, crowned the new Queen, Jamie Evans, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. James Evans. The new Queen is 17 years old and is a Senior in Hedley High School. Second place contestant was Kathy Spier, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Windoal Spier, also 17 and a Senior in Hedley High School. The third place contestant was Kim Steele, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. A. J. Rowell, who is 15 and a Freshman in Hedley High School. The ten beautiful girls in the contest all worked hard, and raised a total of \$2385.40 to help put over the Festival.

Another excellent feature of the Festival was the kiddie parade on Saturday morning, which had many clever and amusing entries.

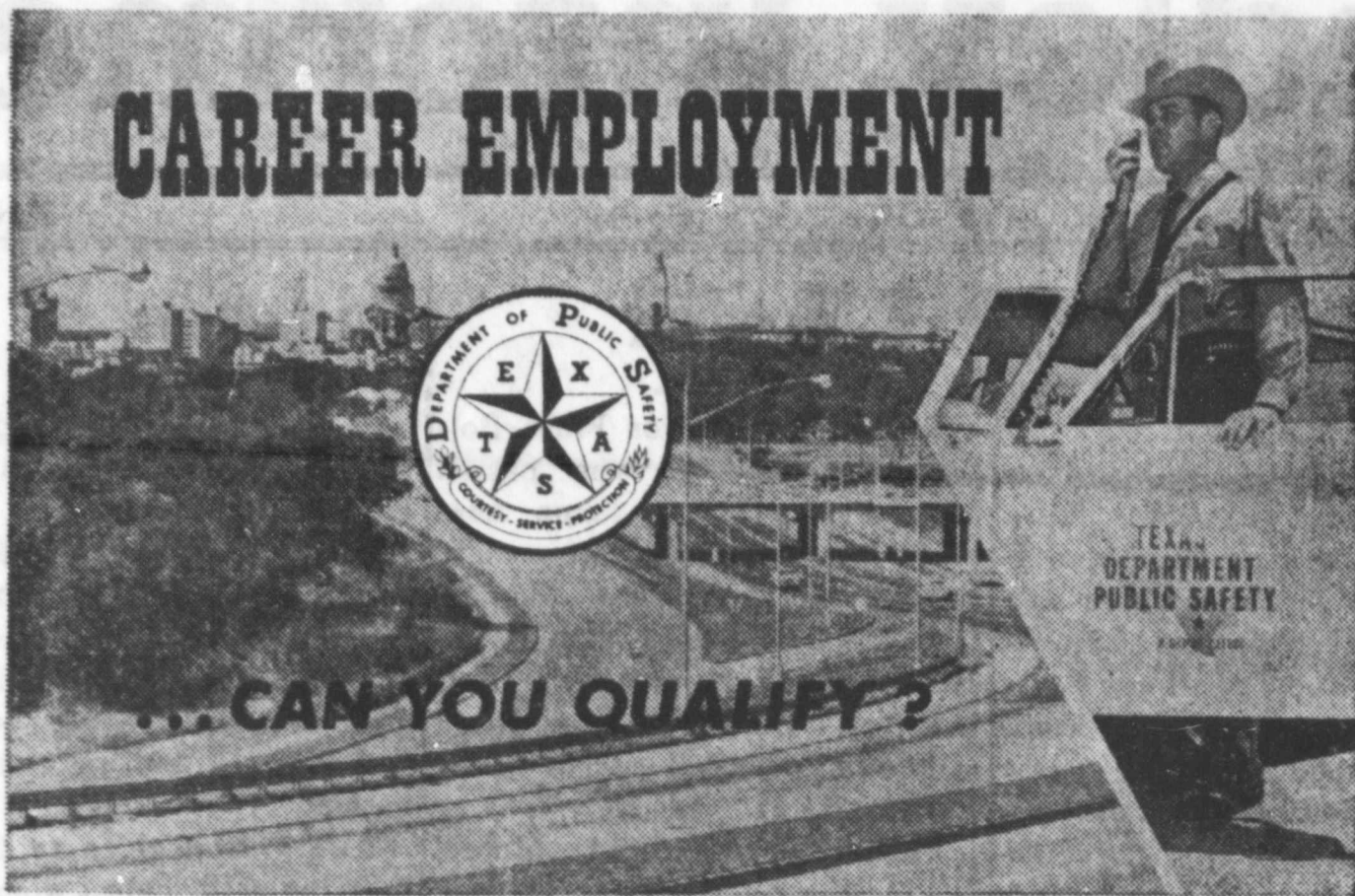

Approximately 95% of all the soil bank payments have been made. The remainder of the payments will be made as soon as more appropriations are received.

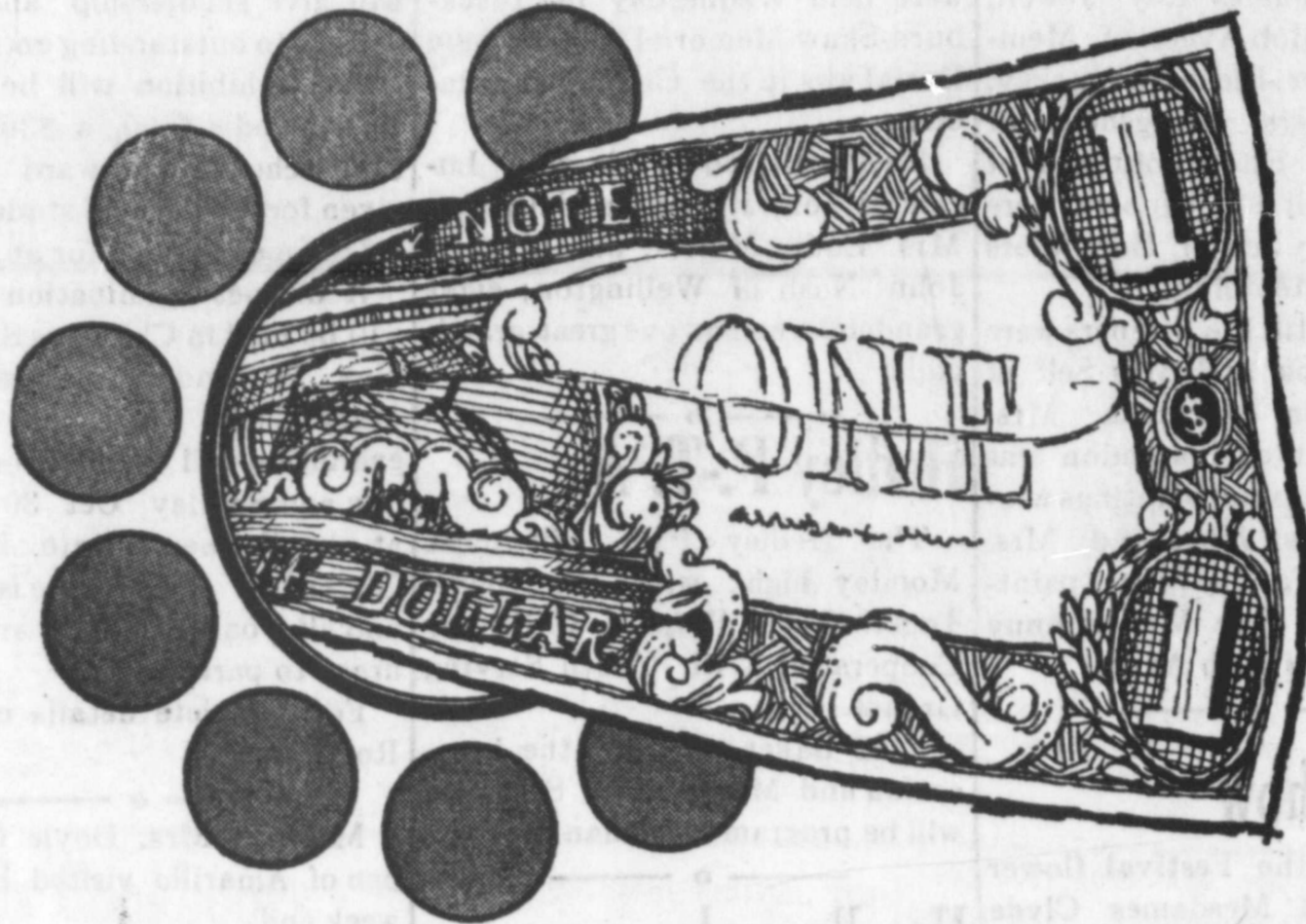
Cotton Marketing Cards

Loan Rates
The grain sorghum loan rate for 1965 in Donley County is \$1.63 per hundredweight for No. 2 or better grades, less applicable storage and service charges.

The basic loan rate for middling one inch cotton is 28.99 cents.

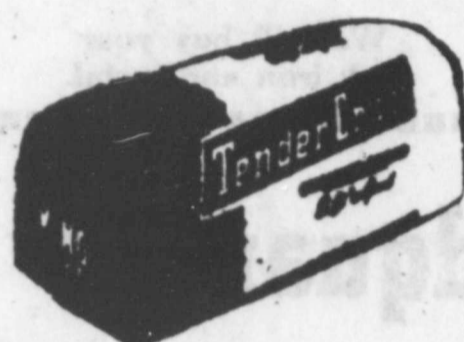
