## Amendments

There will be ten constitutional amendments to be voted on next Tuesday, Nov. 2. A brief summary of them is:

No. 1, Increasing the ad valorem tax for the college building fund.

No. 2, An extension of the veterans land fund.

No. 3, Extended eligibility for medical care for the aged.

No. 4, Four year terms for the governor and other state officials.

No. 5, Investment authority for the teacher retirement fund.

No. 6, College student loan fund

No. 7, Hospital tax exemption

No. 8, Automatic retirement of judges at age 75

No. 9, Salary increase for lieutenant governor, speaker, and members of the legislature

No. 10, Four year terms for state representatives

The only comment this editor has to make on these issues is that I am very much opposed to four year terms for any state official. It is bad enough to have to put up with some of the characters who get in office for two years.

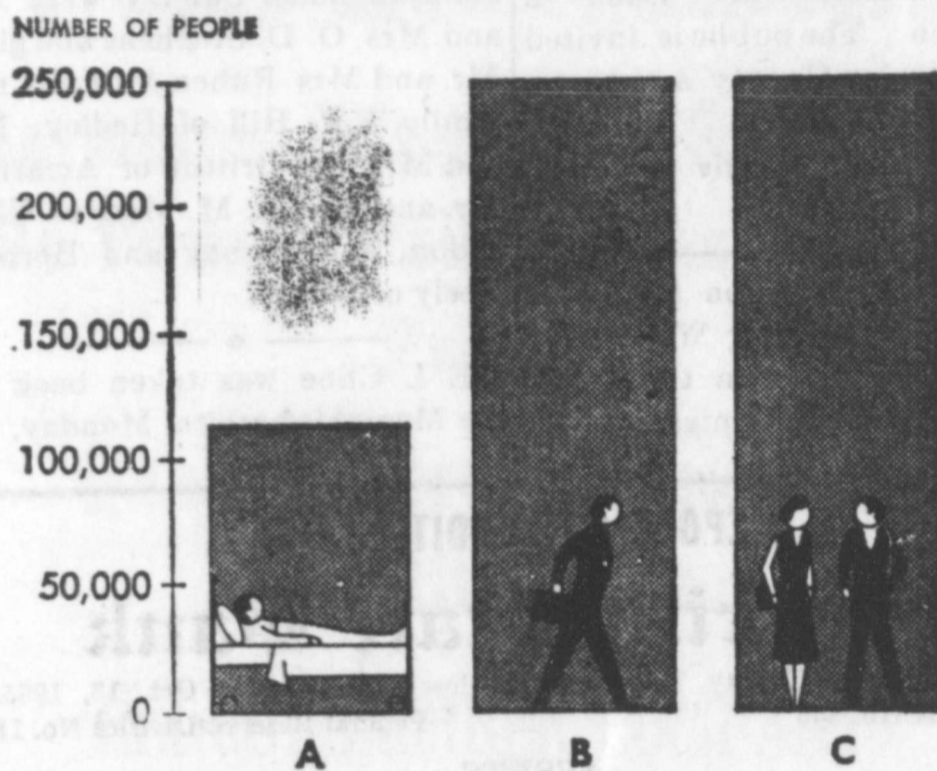

### TB: the Problem that Won't Go Away

610,000 Americans still have active tuberculosis or are classified as "high risk" individuals.



- A. 110,000 are known to have active tuberculosis.
- B. 250,000 are recently recovered TB patients, many of whom are subject to relapse.
- C. 250,000 are known to have had contact with new active TB cases recently reported.

610,000 persons, all told, are now in the TB picture—either as actively ill patients or in the "high risk" category. Christmas Seal funds help provide the hope and the means of achieving ultimate control and eradication of tuberculosis in the U. S.

### Cotton Report

A late planted crop and considerable acreage of replanted hail damaged cotton coupled with the practice in recent years of the almost complete harvesting by machines has made the 1965 crop one of the slowest on record. While some defoliation has taken place, most farmers will wait on a killing frost before harvesting and it is hoped that it will be late. An early frost could damage considerably this crop in yield and quality. This is the summation of the Eastern Panhandle crop by the USDA's Consumer and Marketing Service in Memphis, Texas.

Through Friday, October 22, a seasonal total of 3100 samples were classed compared with 5400 as of the same date last season, and nearly 46 000 in 1961. This reflects the delay in harvesting even though a good portion of the cotton is open according to K. E. Voelkel in charge of the Memphis Classing office.

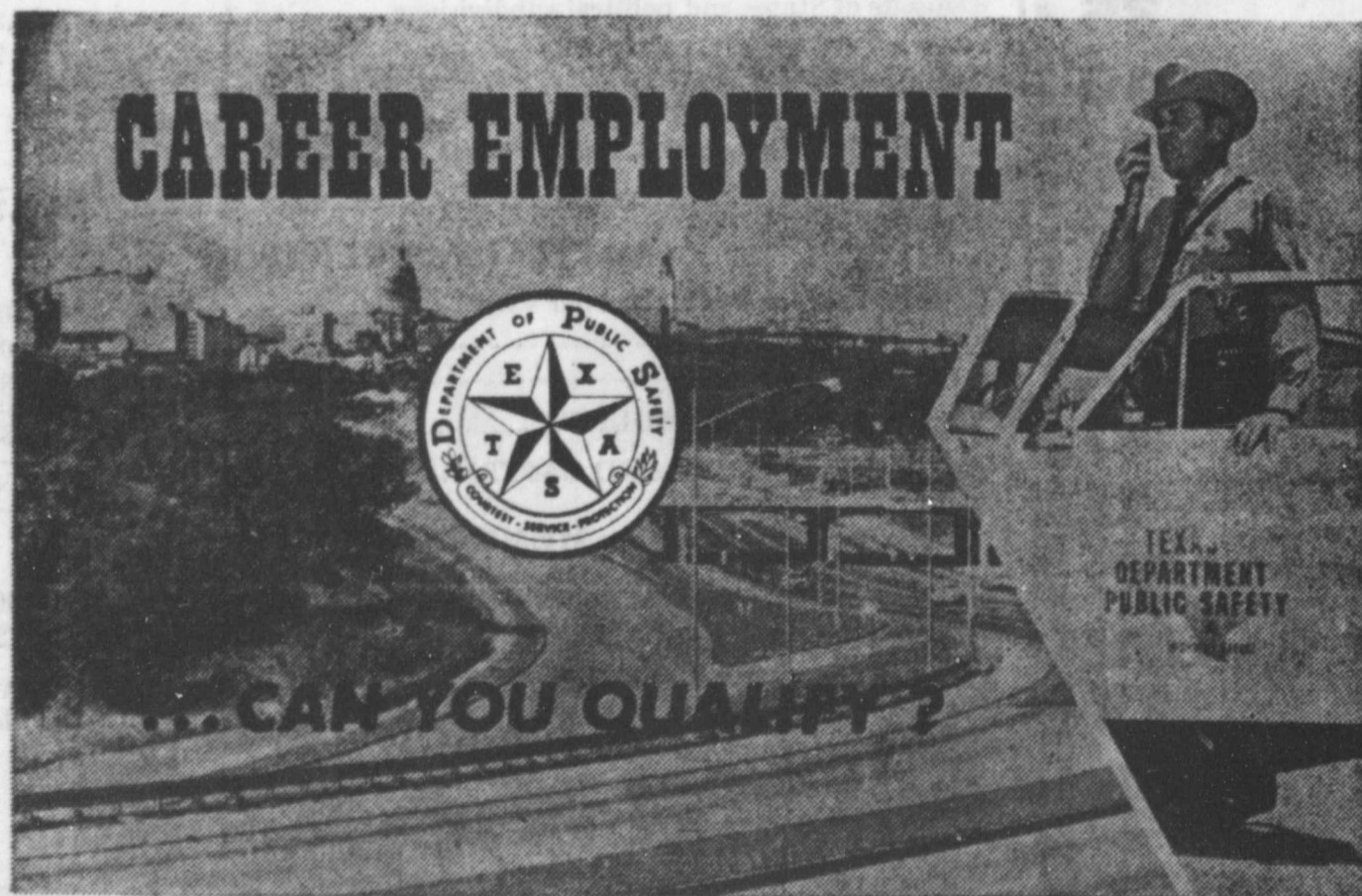


